## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to certain claims for benefits or compensation by

- 3 survivors of fire fighters.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 615.021, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsections (d-1), (d-2), and (d-3) to read as follows:
- 7 (d-1) In a determination of whether the survivor of an
- 8 individual listed under Section 615.003(10), (11), or (12) is
- 9 eligible for the payment of assistance under this chapter, the
- 10 opinion of the individual's employer on whether the individual's
- 11 death resulted from an illness caused by line-of-duty work may not
- 12 <u>be considered.</u>
- 13 <u>(d-2)</u> In a determination on the payment of assistance under
- 14 Subsection (d) to a survivor of an individual listed under Section
- 15 615.003(10), (11), or (12) who died as a result of an illness caused
- 16 by line-of-duty work, consideration shall be given to scientific
- 17 evidence that establishes:
- 18 <u>(1) an incidence rate for the individual's illness</u>
- 19 that is statistically significantly higher among persons
- 20 performing the same job duties as the individual compared to the
- 21 incidence rate of the illness for the general population; or
- 22 (2) a causal link between the individual's illness and
- 23 a hazardous condition encountered by the individual in performing
- 24 the individual's job duties.

- 1 (d-3) If an individual listed under Section 615.003(10),
- 2 (11), or (12) died as a result of a newly discovered or rare cancer
- 3 for which the scientific evidence described in Subsection (d-2)
- 4 does not exist, consideration shall be given to the medical opinion
- 5 of the individual's treating oncologist.
- 6 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 7 a claim for benefits or compensation brought on or after the
- 8 effective date of this Act. A claim for benefits or compensation
- 9 brought before that date is covered by the law in effect on the date
- 10 the claim was brought, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 11 purpose.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
