- declaration was recorded before January 1, 1994. 8
- 9 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 82, Property Code, is
- 10 amended by adding Section 82.121 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 82.121. POSSESSION OF CONCEALED HANDGUN ON CONDOMINIUM
- 12 PROPERTY. (a) Notwithstanding any provision of a dedicatory
- instrument to the contrary, a condominium unit owner, or a tenant or 13
- 14 guest of a condominium unit owner, or a guest of a tenant of a
- condominium unit owner may not be prohibited from carrying a 15
- 16 concealed handgun under the authority of Subchapter H, Chapter 411,
- Government Code, on condominium property as necessary to enter the 17
- owner's unit, to exit the condominium property from the owner's 18
- unit, or to enter a vehicle on the condominium property. 19
- (b) This section applies to a provision of a dedicatory 20
- instrument regardless of the date of the provision's adoption. 21

- 1 PREMISES. Unless possession of a handgun on a landlord's property
- 2 is prohibited by state or federal law, a landlord may not prohibit a
- 3 tenant or a tenant's guest from carrying a concealed handgun under
- 4 the authority of Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code, on the
- 5 <u>leased premises of a multifamily property as necessary to enter the</u>
- 6 tenant's dwelling unit, to exit the leased premises, or to enter a
- 7 <u>vehicle on the leased premises.</u>
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 92.026, Property Code, as added by this
- 9 Act, does not affect the enforceability of a provision in a lease
- 10 entered into or renewed before the effective date of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
