2	relating to the high school graduation of a student who transfers to
3	a public school in this state after the student's junior year of
4	high school.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 28.025, Education Code, is amended by
7	adding Subsection (c-9) to read as follows:
8	(c-9) Notwithstanding Subsection (c), a person may receive
9	a diploma if the person is eligible for a diploma under Section
10	<u>28.02591.</u>
11	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
12	amended by adding Section 28.02591 to read as follows:
13	Sec. 28.02591. HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA AWARDED TO TRANSFER
14	STUDENT ON BASIS OF INDIVIDUAL GRADUATION COMMITTEE REVIEW. (a)
15	This section applies only to a student who:

- (1) transfers into the public school system of this 16
- 17 state after completion of the student's 11th grade year in high
- school in a different state; and 18
- 19 (2) will:
- (A) be unable, based on the credit awarded to the 20
- 21 student by the public school system for coursework completed in a
- different state, to comply with the curriculum requirements of this 22
- state for high school graduation by the end of the student's 12th 23
- 24 grade year; or

- 1 (B) have difficulty complying with the
- 2 end-of-course assessment instrument requirements for high school
- 3 graduation imposed under Section 39.025.
- 4 (b) For each student to whom this section applies, the
- 5 school district that the student attends shall establish an
- 6 individual graduation committee at the beginning of the student's
- 7 12th grade year to determine whether the student may qualify to
- 8 graduate as provided by this section. A student may not qualify to
- 9 graduate under this section before the student's 12th grade year.
- 10 The committee shall be composed of:
- 11 (1) the principal or principal's designee;
- 12 (2) the department chair or lead teacher for each
- 13 <u>subject for which an end-of-course assessment instrument is</u>
- 14 administered under Section 39.023(c); and
- 15 (3) the student's parent or person standing in
- 16 parental relation to the student or the student, if the student is
- 17 at least 18 years of age.
- 18 (c) The superintendent of each school district shall
- 19 establish procedures for the convening of an individual graduation
- 20 committee under this section.
- 21 (d) In determining whether a student for whom an individual
- 22 graduation committee is established is qualified to graduate, the
- 23 committee shall consider:
- 24 (1) the recommendation of the student's teacher in
- 25 <u>each course for which the student was not administered an</u>
- 26 end-of-course assessment instrument;
- 27 (2) the student's performance on each:

1 (A) alternative nationally recognized 2 norm-referenced assessment instrument that the student requests to 3 be considered; or 4 (B) Texas Success Initiative (TSI) assessment 5 instrument that the student requests to be considered; 6 (3) the student's overall preparedness for postsecondary success; and 7 8 (4) any other academic information designated for consideration by the board of trustees of the school district. 9 (e) After considering the criteria under Subsection (d), 10 the individual graduation committee may determine that the student 11 12 is qualified to graduate. The commissioner by rule shall establish a timeline for making a determination under this subsection. The 13 14 decision of a committee is final and may not be appealed. 15 (f) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to implement this section. 16 17 SECTION 3. Section 39.025, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsections (h) and (i) to read as follows: 18 19 (h) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the commissioner shall allow a student to satisfy the requirements 20 of Subsection (a) and qualify for a high school diploma through 21 satisfactory performance on one or more alternative nationally 22 recognized norm-referenced assessment instruments or Texas Success 23 24 Initiative (TSI) assessment instruments if the student transfers into the public school system of this state after completion of the 25

student's 11th grade year in high school in a different state and

the student receives a recommendation by the student's individual

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- 1 graduation committee under Section 28.02591 that the student
- 2 qualifies for a high school diploma.
- 3 (i) For purposes of Subsection (h), the commissioner, in
- 4 order to ensure that a student described by that subsection may
- 5 satisfy the requirements of Subsection (a) solely through
- 6 performance on one or more alternative nationally recognized
- 7 norm-referenced assessment instruments or Texas Success Initiative
- 8 (TSI) assessment instruments, shall establish required performance
- 9 levels for the assessment instruments that correspond to the
- 10 performance levels otherwise required under Subsection (a) on the
- 11 secondary exit-level assessment instruments for English language
- 12 arts, mathematics, social studies, and science.
- 13 SECTION 4. Section 28.02591, Education Code, as added by
- 14 this Act, and Section 39.025, Education Code, as amended by this
- 15 Act, apply beginning with students enrolled in public high schools
- 16 in this state as a senior during the 2017-2018 school year.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
