- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 102, Code of Criminal
- 6 Procedure, is amended by adding Article 102.0111 to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 Art. 102.0111. FEES FOR PRETRIAL DIVERSION PROGRAMS. A
- 9 county pretrial services office may collect a supervision fee in an
- 10 amount not to exceed \$60 each month from a defendant participating
- 11 in a pretrial diversion program operated by that office. If the
- 12 office determines that the defendant is indigent, the office may
- 13 require the defendant to pay a fee of less than \$60 only in an amount
- 14 the office determines would not cause undue hardship for the
- 15 defendant. The defendant may be required to pay the fee under this
- 16 article as a condition of participating in the program.
- 17 SECTION 2. Article 103.004, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 18 amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 19 (e) The custodian of the county treasury shall deposit in a
- 20 special fund of the county treasury for the county pretrial
- 21 services office serving the county money received from fees imposed
- 22 under Article 102.0111, to be used only for the pretrial diversion
- 23 program operated by that office.

- 2 Sec. 103.02101. ADDITIONAL FEE FOR PRETRIAL DIVERSION
- 3 PROGRAM: CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE. A defendant participating in
- 4 <u>a pretrial diversion program operated by a county pretrial services</u>
- 5 office shall, if required by the office, pay a supervision fee under
- 6 Article 102.0111, Code of Criminal Procedure, in an amount not to
- 7 exceed \$60 each month.
- 8 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to a defendant who participates in a pretrial diversion program
- 10 that begins on or after the effective date of this Act. A defendant
- 11 who participates in a pretrial diversion program that begins before
- 12 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when
- 13 the program began, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 14 that purpose.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
