## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 4  | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:              |
| 5  | SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 81, Health and Safety               |
| 6  | Code, is amended by adding Section 81.110 to read as follows:        |
| 7  | Sec. 81.110. COUNSELING REQUIRED FOR NEGATIVE TEST RESULTS.          |
| 8  | (a) If a health care provider, as defined by Section 161.201,        |
| 9  | determines that a person is at a high risk for contracting HIV       |
| 10 | infection, the provider may not reveal a negative test result to the |
| 11 | person tested without giving that person the immediate opportunity   |
| 12 | for individual, face-to-face post-test counseling and written        |
| 13 | information from a readily available source, including the           |
| 14 | department and the federal Centers for Disease Control and           |
| 15 | Prevention, on:  |
| 16 | (1) the limitations of HIV testing technology;                       |
| 17 | (2) the time required for verification of a test                     |
| 18 | result;  |
| 19 | (3) the possible need for additional testing; and                    |
| 20 | (4) measures to prevent the transmission of HIV,                     |
| 21 | including pre-exposure and postexposure prophylaxis.                 |
| 22 | (b) Subsection (a) does not apply if:                                |
| 23 | (1) a report of a test result is used for statistical                |
| 24 | or research purposes only and any information that could identify    |

- 1 the person is removed from the report; or
- 2 (2) the test is conducted for the sole purpose of
- 3 screening blood, blood products, bodily fluids, organs, or tissues
- 4 to determine suitability for donation.
- 5 (c) A person who is injured by an intentional violation of
- 6 this section may bring a civil action for damages and may recover
- 7 for each violation from a person who violates this section:
- 8 (1) \$1,000 or actual damages, whichever is greater;
- 9 and
- 10 (2) reasonable attorney fees.
- 11 (d) This section does not prohibit the appropriate
- 12 licensing authorities from conducting disciplinary proceedings for
- 13 a health care provider's violation of this section.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 81.110, Health and Safety Code, as added
- 15 by this Act, applies only to an HIV test performed by a health care
- 16 provider on or after January 1, 2018.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
