Section 85.025(a-1), Family Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a-1) The court may render a protective order sufficient to protect the applicant and members of the applicant's family or 8 9 household that is effective for a period that exceeds two years if the court finds that the person who is the subject of the protective 10 11 order: 12 (1)committed an act constituting a felony offense involving family violence against the applicant or a member of the 13 14 applicant's family or household, regardless of whether the person has been charged with or convicted of the offense; 15 16 (2) caused serious bodily injury to the applicant or a member of the applicant's family or household; or 17 18 (3) [(2)] was the subject of two or more previous protective orders rendered: 19 20 (A) to protect the person on whose behalf the 21 current protective order is sought; and 22 (B) after a finding by the court that the subject 23 of the protective order: 24 has committed family violence; and (i)

H.B. No. 2021 (ii) is likely to commit family violence in the future. SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only

4 to an application for a protective order that is filed on or after 5 the effective date of this Act. An application for a protective 6 order filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the 7 law in effect on the date the application is filed, and the former 8 law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
