## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to staff requirements for certain facilities that provide
3	care to persons with Alzheimer's disease or dementia.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle G, Title 4, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 326 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 326. STAFF REQUIREMENTS FOR FACILITIES PROVIDING CARE TO
8	PERSONS WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE OR DEMENTIA
9	Sec. 326.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
11	Commission.
12	(2) "Facility" means:
13	(A) a nursing facility or other institution
14	licensed under Chapter 242;
15	(B) a continuing care facility regulated under
16	Chapter 246;
17	(C) an assisted living facility licensed under
18	Chapter 247;
19	(D) a day activity and health services facility
20	licensed under Chapter 103, Human Resources Code;
21	(E) an establishment subject to Chapter 105,
22	Human Resources Code;
23	(F) a community home qualified under Chapter 123,
24	Human Resources Code; and

- (G) an adult foster care provider that contracts
- 2 with the commission.
- 3 Sec. 326.002. STAFF REQUIREMENTS. A facility that provides
- 4 care to a person with Alzheimer's disease or dementia shall employ
- 5 at least one individual who:
- 6 (1) has training or experience in providing care to
- 7 persons with Alzheimer's disease or dementia; and
- 8 (2) is able to provide adequate treatment and care for
- 9 the person.
- Sec. 326.003. ENFORCEMENT. If a facility that is licensed
- 11 or regulated by or contracts with the commission or another state
- 12 agency violates this chapter, the commission or appropriate agency
- 13 shall, as applicable:
- 14 (1) revoke the license issued to the facility;
- 15 (2) revoke the facility's certificate of authority or
- 16 any other permission issued by the commission or state agency for
- 17 the facility to operate; or
- 18 (3) revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew a contract
- 19 between the commission or state agency and the facility.
- 20 SECTION 2. Chapter 326, Health and Safety Code, as added by
- 21 this Act, does not affect the terms of a contract entered into
- 22 before the effective date of this Act, except that if the contract
- 23 is renewed, modified, or extended on or after the effective date of
- 24 this Act, Chapter 326 applies to the contract beginning on the date
- 25 of renewal, modification, or extension.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
