A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to automatic expunction of arrest records and files for

3 certain persons who are tried for an offense and subsequently

4 acquitted.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 1, Article 55.02, Code of Criminal

7 Procedure, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1. The [At the request of the defendant and after 8 9 notice to the state, the] trial court presiding over the case in which the person [defendant] was acquitted, if the trial court is a 10 11 district court, or a district court in the county in which the trial 12 court is located shall enter an order of expunction for a person entitled to expunction under Article 55.01(a)(1)(A) not later than 13 14 the 30th day after the date of the acquittal. [Upon acquittal, the trial court shall advise the defendant of the right to expunction. 15 The defendant shall provide to the district court all of the 16 information required in a petition for expunction under Section 17 2(b).] The person's attorney [for the defendant] in the case in 18 which the person [defendant] was acquitted, if the acquitted person 19 [defendant] was represented by counsel, or the attorney for the 20 21 state, if the <u>acquitted person</u> [defendant] was not represented by counsel, shall prepare the order for the court's signature. trial court is not a district court, the trial court shall forward

the proposed order, and all information required in a petition for

- 1 expunction under Section 2(b), to a district court in the county to
- 2 proceed in the manner provided by this section.
- 3 SECTION 2. (a) This Act applies to the expunction of arrest
- 4 records and files for a person entitled to that expunction under
- 5 Article 55.01(a)(1)(A), Code of Criminal Procedure, before, on, or
- 6 after the effective date of this Act, regardless of when the
- 7 underlying arrest occurred.
- 8 (b) For a person who is entitled to expunction under Article
- 9 55.01(a)(1)(A), Code of Criminal Procedure, based on an acquittal
- 10 that occurred before the effective date of this Act,
- 11 notwithstanding the 30-day time limit provided for the court to
- 12 enter an automatic order of expunction under Section 1, Article
- 13 55.02, Code of Criminal Procedure, as amended by this Act, the court
- 14 shall enter an order of expunction for the person as soon as
- 15 practicable after the court receives written notice from any party
- 16 to the case about the person's entitlement to the expunction.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
