3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 453.301, Occupations Code, is amended to

6	Sec. 453.301. <u>PRACTICE BY PHYSICAL THERAPIST</u> [TREATING
7	PATIENT UNDER PRIOR REFERRAL]. (a) A physical therapist may treat
8	a patient for an injury or condition <u>in a manner described by</u>

11	(1) has been licensed to practice physical therapy for
12	at least one year;
13	(2) <u>is covered by professional liability insurance in</u>
14	the minimum amount required by board rule [notifies the referring

18	(A) possesses a doctoral degree in physical

No. 2118 1 competence; (3) been convicted of a felony, including a finding or 2 3 verdict of guilty, an admission of guilt, or a plea of nolo contendere, in this state or in any other state or nation; 4 5 (4) obtained or attempted to obtain a license by fraud 6 or deception; 7 (5) been grossly negligent in the practice of physical 8 therapy or in acting as a physical therapist assistant; 9 (6) been found to be mentally incompetent by a court; 10 (7)practiced physical therapy in a manner detrimental to the public health and welfare; 11 had a license to practice physical therapy revoked 12 (8) or suspended or had other disciplinary action taken against the 13 14 license holder or applicant; 15 (9) had the license holder's or applicant's application for a license refused, revoked, or suspended by the 16 proper licensing authority of another state or nation; or 17 in the case of a physical therapist assistant, 18 (10)treated a person other than under the direction of a physical 19 20 therapist. 21 SECTION 3. Not later than November 1, 2017, the Texas Board of Physical Therapy Examiners shall adopt rules necessary to 22 implement Section 453.301, Occupations Code, as amended by this 23 24 Act. 25 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
