A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to required training for veterans county service officers
- 3 and assistant veterans county service officers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 434.007, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 434.007. DUTIES. The commission shall:
- 8 (1) compile federal, state, and local laws enacted to
- 9 benefit members of the armed forces, veterans, and their families
- 10 and dependents;
- 11 (2) collect information relating to services and
- 12 facilities available to veterans;
- 13 (3) cooperate with veterans service agencies in the
- 14 state;
- 15 (4) inform members and veterans of the armed forces,
- 16 their families and dependents, and military and civilian
- 17 authorities about the existence or availability of:
- 18 (A) educational training and retraining
- 19 facilities;
- 20 (B) health, medical, rehabilitation, and housing
- 21 services and facilities;
- (C) employment and reemployment services;
- (D) provisions of federal, state, and local law
- 24 affording rights, privileges, and benefits to members and veterans

- 1 of the armed forces and their families and dependents; and
- 2 (E) other similar, related, or appropriate
- 3 matters;
- 4 (5) assist veterans and their families and dependents
- 5 in presenting, proving, and establishing claims, privileges,
- 6 rights, and benefits they may have under federal, state, or local
- 7 law;
- 8 (6) cooperate with all government and private agencies
- 9 securing services or benefits to veterans and their families and
- 10 dependents;
- 11 (7) investigate, and if possible correct, abuses or
- 12 exploitation of veterans or their families or dependents, and
- 13 recommend necessary legislation for full correction;
- 14 (8) coordinate the services and activities of state
- 15 departments and divisions having services and resources affecting
- 16 veterans or their families or dependents;
- 17 (9) approve a provider of [provide] training for and
- 18 certify [certification of] veterans county service officers and
- 19 assistant veterans county service officers in accordance with
- 20 Section 434.038;
- 21 (10) through surveys or other reasonable and accurate
- 22 methods of estimation, collect and maintain for each county in the
- 23 state the number of servicemembers and veterans residing in the
- 24 county and annually update and publish the information on the
- 25 commission's website; and
- 26 (11) with the assistance and cooperation of the
- 27 comptroller, inform and assist veterans and their families and

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- 1 dependents with respect to discovering and initiating claims for
- 2 unclaimed property held by the United States Department of Veterans
- 3 Affairs.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 434.038, Government Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 434.038. TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION. (a) An officer
- 7 shall, within the time after the date of the officer's appointment
- 8 that the commission prescribes, complete a course of initial
- 9 training [provided by the Texas Veterans Commission]. The
- 10 commission shall issue the officer a certificate of training after
- 11 completion of the initial training course. To maintain
- 12 certification, the officer shall complete continuing training to
- 13 the extent required by the commission. An officer must maintain
- 14 certification to remain in office.
- 15 (a-1) <u>Initial and continuing training required under this</u>
- 16 section shall be provided by a public or private entity approved by
- 17 the commission under Subsection (d) [The commission shall develop
- 18 and implement methods for providing training to officers. The
- 19 methods may include Internet-based seminars, participation through
- 20 videoconference, cooperation with training provided by the United
- 21 States Department of Veterans Affairs, and other methods as
- 22 appropriate].
- 23 (b) [The commission shall provide, at commission expense,
- 24 the initial and continuing training required by this section at
- 25 least once each year.
- 26 $\left[\frac{(c)}{c}\right]$ The commissioners court of an officer's county shall
- 27 reimburse an officer's travel and lodging expenses incurred in

- 1 attending [commission] training required under this section unless
- 2 state funds are appropriated for that purpose. If state funds are
- 3 appropriated, the commission shall make the reimbursement in the
- 4 manner prescribed for the reimbursement of these expenses to state
- 5 employees.
- 6 (c) [(d)] The commission shall develop [standard course
- 7 $\frac{\text{materials}_{\tau}}{\text{materials}_{\tau}}$ training curriculum[$\frac{1}{\tau}$] and examinations to be used for
- 8 county service officer certification and United States Department
- 9 of Veterans Affairs accreditation.
- 10 (d) $\left(\frac{\text{(e)}}{\text{(e)}}\right)$ The commission shall:
- 11 (1) maintain [course materials and] examinations in a
- 12 central location [and provide county service offices and commission
- 13 field staff with access to the course materials on the commission's
- 14 Internet website];
- 15 (2) regularly update [course materials,] training
- 16 $curriculum[_{\tau}]$ and examinations after consulting with:
- 17 (A) the United States Department of Veterans
- 18 Affairs to ensure the [course materials_{τ}] training curriculum[τ]
- 19 and examinations are accurate and meet applicable United States
- 20 Department of Veterans Affairs requirements; and
- 21 (B) accredited county service officers to ensure
- 22 the $[materials_{\tau}]$ training curriculum $[\tau]$ and examinations include
- 23 issues developing at the county level;
- 24 (3) develop a training handbook containing
- 25 instruction and case studies addressing:
- 26 (A) general assistance techniques, including how
- 27 to provide general information regarding state and federal benefits

- 1 and referrals for other services and to other agencies, and general
- 2 information regarding state and federal benefits;
- 3 (B) basic counseling approaches for assisting
- 4 veterans, their family members, and other eligible dependents
- 5 filing benefit claims;
- 6 (C) basic information on United States
- 7 Department of Veterans Affairs processes and procedures, including
- 8 how to accurately complete claims and appeals forms and how to
- 9 support claims;
- 10 (D) methods of collecting required documentation
- 11 and developing claims and appeals;
- 12 (E) methods of documenting progress and updating
- 13 a veteran's, a veteran's family member's, or another eligible
- 14 dependent's case information;
- 15 (F) methods of assisting veterans, their family
- 16 members, or other eligible dependents in pursuing appeals,
- 17 including offering case knowledge in appeals hearings; and
- 18 (G) methods of representing veterans, their
- 19 family members, or other eligible dependents during appeals
- 20 hearings; [and]
- 21 (4) coordinate with the Department of State Health
- 22 Services to incorporate a suicide prevention component as part of
- 23 the accreditation training curriculum and examination; and
- 24 (5) approve a public or private entity that is
- 25 <u>accredited by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to</u>
- 26 provide initial and continuing training required under this
- 27 section.

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- 1 $\underline{\text{(e)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(f)}}{\text{)}}$] The commission may establish rules to carry out
- 2 the purposes of this section, including rules regarding carryover
- 3 of credit for extra course attendance from one year into subsequent
- 4 years and the anniversary date by which the continuing
- 5 certification requirement must be met.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
