Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 28.0141 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 28.0141. COLLEGE READINESS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. (a) In this section, "institution of higher 8 9 education" has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003. (b) Each school district shall enter into a memorandum of 10 understanding with at least one institution of higher education to 11 coordinate efforts in ensuring students are prepared for 12 postsecondary education opportunities. A memorandum 13 of understanding must: 14 (1) provide for joint professional development 15 16 opportunities for school counselors and academic advisors to promote collaboration and support the creation of common practices 17 and terminology relating to college readiness; 18 19 (2) identify the pathways between the endorsements under Section 28.025(c-1) that are available to students in the 20 district and degree programs and fields of study relating to those 21 endorsements that are available at the institution; 22 23 (3) develop tools based on the pathways identified under Subdivision (2) for school counselors and academic advisors 24

1	to assist students in selecting a suitable program of study; and
2	(4) identify opportunities to increase the cost
3	efficiency and coordination of related programs in areas that
4	include the following:
5	(A) technology;
6	(B) facilities and equipment;
7	(C) dual credit course staffing and
8	certification; and
9	(D) transportation.
10	SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018
11	school year.
12	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
13	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
14	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
15	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
16	Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
