5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 28.0141 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 28.0141. COLLEGE READINESS MEMORANDUM OF
8	UNDERSTANDING. (a) In this section, "institution of higher
9	education" has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
10	(b) Each school district shall enter into a memorandum of
11	understanding with at least one institution of higher education to
12	coordinate efforts in ensuring students are prepared for
13	postsecondary education opportunities. A memorandum of
14	understanding must:
15	(1) provide for joint professional development
16	opportunities for school counselors and academic advisors to
17	promote collaboration and support the creation of common practices
18	and terminology relating to college readiness;
19	(2) identify the pathways between the endorsements
20	under Section 28.025(c-1) that are available to students in the
21	district and degree programs and fields of study relating to those
22	endorsements that are available at the institution;

to assist students in selecting a suitable program of study; and 1 2 (4) identify opportunities to increase the cost efficiency and coordination of related programs in areas that 3 include the following: 4 (A) technology; 5 6 (B) facilities and equipment; 7 (C) dual credit course staffing 8 certification; and 9 (D) transportation. SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018 10 school year. 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 13

provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
