## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the establishment of a workgroup to examine the

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 37.0831, Education Code, is amended by
7	adding Subsections (f), (g), (h), and (i) to read as follows:
8	(f) The commissioner shall establish a workgroup to make
9	recommendations related to ensuring and improving implementation
10	of the dating violence policy required under Subsection (a) in
11	public schools. The workgroup must be composed of:
12	(1) one member from the agency;
13	(2) one member from the Texas State Teachers
14	Association;
15	(3) one member from the Texas American Federation of
16	Teachers;
17	(4) one member from the Association of Texas
18	Professional Educators;
19	(5) one member from the Texas Association of School
20	Boards;
21	(6) one member from the Texas Association of School
22	Administrators;
23	(7) one member from the Texas School Counselor
24	Association;

1	(8) one member from the Texas Association of Secondary
2	School Principals;
3	(9) one member from the Texas School Nurses
4	Organization;
5	(10) one member from the Texas School Safety Center;
6	(11) one member from the Texas High School Coaches
7	Association;
8	(12) three campus safety officers;
9	(13) four members from family violence centers, as
10	defined by Section 51.002, Human Resources Code, from different
11	geographic regions in this state, including both rural and urban
12	areas;
13	(14) one member from a statewide family violence
14	advocacy organization;
15	(15) one member from a statewide sexual assault
16	advocacy organization;
17	(16) one member from a statewide advocacy organization
18	that serves teenage victims of dating violence;
19	(17) one member from the statewide intake division or
20	the investigation division of the Department of Family and
21	Protective Services;
22	(18) one member from the Parenting and Paternity
23	Awareness program in the office of the attorney general;
24	(19) one member from the family violence program in
25	the Health and Human Services Commission;
26	(20) two members from the Texas Juvenile Justice
27	Department, including one member who has experience with juvenile

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   probation; and
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               (21) one member who is affiliated with a university in
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   the state and has expertise in research on dating violence.
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         (g) The workgroup shall:
               (1) recommend specific methods of implementing
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   training for educators and school administrators under the policy
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   required by Subsection (a);
               (2) recommend specific methods of implementing
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   awareness education for parents and students under the policy
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   required by Subsection (a);
               (3) recommend improvements to the policy required by

   Subsection (a);
               (4) propose amendments to Section 11.252 that would
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   incorporate into district-level planning and decision-making the
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   policy required by Subsection (a);
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              (5) examine the intersection between juvenile justice
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   and youth dating violence;
               (6) develop strategies for enhancing the safety and
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   security of school campuses in the context of dating violence; and
               (7) develop specific <u>approaches</u>
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                                                         for
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   implementation of dating violence training and awareness education
   in middle schools.
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         (h) The workgroup established under Subsection (f) shall
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   report its recommendations to the legislature not later than
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(i) This subsection and Subsections (f), (g), and (h) expire

September 1, 2018.

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

5 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
