- 23 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter,

- SECTION 5. Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 411.1993 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 411.1993. CERTAIN MEMBERS OF TEXAS MILITARY FORCES.
- 13 (a) A person who is a member of the Texas military forces, other
- 14 than a member of the Texas State Guard who is serving in the Texas
- 15 Legislature, may apply for a license under this subchapter.
- 16 (b) The department shall adopt rules regarding the
- 17 information required to be included in an application submitted
- 18 under this section.
- 19 (c) The department may issue a license under this subchapter
- 20 to an applicant under this section if the applicant complies with
- 21 rules adopted under Subsection (b).
- 22 (d) An applicant under this section shall pay a fee of \$25
- 23 for a license issued under this subchapter.
- (e) A license issued to an applicant under this section
- 25 expires as provided by Section 411.183.
- SECTION 6. Section 411.1991(a-2), Government Code, is
- 27 repealed.

- SECTION 7. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an application that is made to obtain an original, duplicate, modified, or renewed license to carry a handgun and submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An application described by this section that is submitted before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the application was submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
