## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to a grant program to support the provision of critical
- 3 incident stress debriefing to certain peace officers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 772, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 772.0074 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 772.0074. CRITICAL INCIDENT STRESS DEBRIEFING GRANT
- 8 PROGRAM. (a) In this section:
- 9 <u>(1) "Criminal justice division" means the criminal</u>
- 10 justice division established under Section 772.006.
- 11 (2) "Critical incident" means an incident involving a
- 12 peace officer that occurs while the officer is performing official
- 13 <u>duties</u> and that results in serious bodily injury to the officer or
- 14 poses a substantial risk of serious bodily injury or death to the
- 15 officer or of serious harm to the officer's mental health or
- 16 well-being.

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- 17 (3) "Law enforcement agency" means an agency of the
- 18 state or an agency of a political subdivision of the state that is
- 19 authorized by <u>law to employ peace officers.</u>
- 20 <u>(4) "Peace officer" has the meaning assigned by</u>
- 21 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 22 <u>(b) The criminal justice division shall establish and</u>
- 23 <u>administer a grant program to assist law enforcement agencies in</u>
- 24 providing critical incident stress debriefing to peace officers who

experience critical incidents while performing official duties. 1 2 The criminal justice division may award a grant under 3 this section to: 4 (1) a law enforcement agency for the agency to provide 5 critical incident stress debriefing to peace officers employed by 6 the agency; or 7 (2) any other person for the person to develop 8 critical incident stress debriefing curricula, materials, or best practices that are designed for use by a law enforcement agency that 9 10 receives a grant under this section. (d) A law enforcement agency that receives a grant under 11 12 this section must: (1) inform each peace officer employed by the agency 13 14 about the program, including opportunities to participate in the 15 program; and (2) certify in writing that the agency will not use 16 17 disciplinary action or any other form of punishment, including the refusal of a promotion, to discourage or prohibit an officer's 18 19 participation in the critical incident stress debriefing offered by 20 the agency. 21 (e) The criminal justice division shall establish: (1) eligibility criteria for grant applicants; 2.2 23 (2) grant application procedures; 24 procedures for evaluating grant applications;

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to conduct critical incident stress debriefing that is provided

using money distributed under the grant program; and

(4) the minimum qualifications necessary for a person

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- 1 (5) guidance for the development of critical incident
- 2 stress debriefing curricula, materials, and best practices.
- 3 (f) The criminal justice division shall include in the
- 4 biennial report required by Section 772.006(a)(9) a detailed
- 5 reporting of the results and performance of the grant program
- 6 administered under this section.
- 7 SECTION 2. Not later than October 1, 2017, the criminal
- 8 justice division of the governor's office shall establish the grant
- 9 program required by Section 772.0074, Government Code, as added by
- 10 this Act, and, not later than January 1, 2018, shall begin to award
- 11 grants under the program.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
