 1-16 AN ACT

1-17 relating to restoration of the position of public employees when
 1-18 relieved of duty from the Texas military forces or a similar unit.

1-19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-20 SECTION 1. Section 437.202(d), Government Code, is amended
 1-21 to read as follows:

1-22 (d) An employee of this state or a municipality, a county,
 1-23 or another political subdivision of this state with at least five
 1-24 full-time employees [~~A state employee~~] who is a member of the Texas
 1-25 military forces, a reserve component of the armed forces, or a
 1-26 member of a state or federally authorized urban search and rescue
 1-27 team and who is ordered to duty by proper authority is entitled,
 1-28 when relieved from duty, to be restored to the position that the
 1-29 employee held when ordered to duty.

1-30 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-31 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-32 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-33 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-34 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
