A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to disclosure requirements of certain nursing facilities
3	that provide care for persons with Alzheimer's disease and related
4	disorders.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 242, Health and Safety
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 242.0405 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 242.0405. NOTICE OF ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND RELATED
9	DISORDERS CERTIFICATION. (a) A nursing facility shall prepare a
10	written notice disclosing whether the facility is certified under
11	Section 242.040 for the provision of specialized care and treatment
12	of residents with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.
13	(b) The nursing facility shall provide the notice described
14	by Subsection (a) to:
15	(1) each resident of the facility;
16	(2) each person applying for services from the
17	facility or the person's next of kin or guardian; and
18	(3) any person requesting the information.
19	(c) A nursing facility shall keep a record of each person to
20	whom notice is provided under Subsection (b).
21	SECTION 2. Section 242.042, Health and Safety Code, is
22	amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
23	(a-1) In addition to the information displayed under

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Subsection (a), each institution shall prominently and

- 1 conspicuously post for display in a public area of the institution
- 2 that is readily available to residents, employees, and visitors a
- 3 written notice described by Section 242.0405.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 242.202(d), Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (d) The disclosure statement must contain the following
- 7 categories of information:
- 8 (1) the institution's philosophy of care;
- 9 (2) [whether the institution is certified under
- 10 Section 242.040 for the provision of specialized care and treatment
- 11 of residents with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders;
- 12 $\left[\frac{(3)}{3}\right]$ the preadmission, admission, and discharge
- 13 process;
- (3) $\left[\frac{4}{1}\right]$ resident assessment, care planning, and
- 15 implementation of the care plan;
- 16 $\underline{(4)}$ [$\overline{(5)}$] staffing patterns, such as
- 17 resident-to-staff ratios, and staff training;
- 18 (5) $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ the physical environment of the
- 19 institution;
- 20 $\underline{(6)}$ [$\frac{(7)}{}$] resident activities;
- 21 (7) [(8)] program costs;
- (8) $[\frac{9}{9}]$ systems for evaluation of the institution's
- 23 programs for residents;
- (9) $[\frac{(10)}{(10)}]$ family involvement in resident care; and
- 25 (10) [(11)] the toll-free telephone number maintained
- 26 by the department for acceptance of complaints against the
- 27 institution.

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- 1 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 2 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 3 Services Commission shall adopt rules to implement the changes in
- 4 law made by this Act.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
