H.B. No. 2561

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the continuation and functions of the Texas State Board of Pharmacy; authorizing a reduction in fees. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 481.074(q), Health and Safety Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 7 (q) Each dispensing pharmacist shall send all required information, including any information required to complete the 8 9 Schedule III through V prescription forms, to the board by electronic transfer or another form approved by the board not later 10 next business [<del>seventh</del>] day after the date the 11 than the prescription is completely filled. 12 SECTION 2. Section 481.075(i), Health and Safety Code, is 13 14 amended to read as follows: Each dispensing pharmacist shall: 15 (i) 16 (1) fill in on the official prescription form or note in the electronic prescription record each item of information 17 given orally to the dispensing pharmacy under Subsection (h) and 18 the date the prescription is filled, and: 19 20 (A) for a written prescription, fill in the 21 dispensing pharmacist's signature; or 22 (B) for electronic an prescription, appropriately record the identity of the dispensing pharmacist in 23 the electronic prescription record; 24

No. 2561 1 (2) retain with the records of the pharmacy for at least two years: 2 3 (A) the official prescription form or the electronic prescription record, as applicable; and 4 5 (B) the name or other patient identification required by Section 481.074(m) or (n); and 6 7 (3) send all required information, including any 8 information required to complete an official prescription form or electronic prescription record, to the board by electronic transfer 9 10 or another form approved by the board not later than the next business [seventh] day after the date the prescription is 11 completely filled. 12 SECTION 3. Section 481.0761, Health and Safety Code, is 13 14 amended by adding Subsections (h), (i), and (j) to read as follows: 15 (h) The board, in consultation with the department and the regulatory agencies listed in Section 481.076(a)(1), shall 16 17 identify prescribing practices that may be potentially harmful and patient prescription patterns that may suggest drug diversion or 18 19 drug abuse. The board shall determine the conduct that constitutes a potentially harmful prescribing pattern or practice and develop 20 indicators for levels of prescriber or patient activity that 21 suggest a potentially harmful prescribing pattern or practice may 22 be occurring or drug diversion or drug abuse may be occurring. 23 24 (i) The board, based on the indicators developed under

Subsection (h), may send an electronic notification to a dispenser or prescriber if the information submitted under Section 481.074(q) or 481.075 indicates a potentially harmful prescribing pattern or

1 practice may be occurring or drug diversion or drug abuse may be 2 occurring.

3 (j) The board by rule may develop guidelines identifying behavior suggesting a patient is obtaining controlled substances 4 that indicate drug diversion or drug abuse is occurring. A 5 pharmacist who observes behavior described by this subsection by a 6 person who is to receive a controlled substance shall access the 7 8 information under Section 481.076(a)(5) regarding the patient for whom the substance is to be dispensed. 9 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 481, Health and Safety 10 Code, is amended by adding Sections 481.0763 and 481.0764 to read as 11 12 follows: Sec. 481.0763. DUTY OF PHARMACISTS. A pharmacist must 13 access information under Section 481.076(a)(5) with respect to a 14 patient before dispensing opioids, benzodiazepines, barbiturates, 15

16 <u>or carisoprodol for the patient.</u>
17 Sec. 481.0764. REPORTS OF WHOLESALE PHARMACEUTICAL

DISTRIBUTORS. (a) A wholesale pharmaceutical distributor shall report to the board the sale of a controlled substance made by the distributor to a person in this state. The distributor shall report the information to the board in a similar manner as the distributor reports information to the Federal Drug Enforcement Administration.

25 board under Subsection (a) is included in the state's prescription 26 monitoring program database.

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SECTION 5. Section 551.005, Occupations Code, is amended to

1 read as follows:

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2 Sec. 551.005. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Texas State 3 Board of Pharmacy is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas 4 Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that 5 chapter, the board is abolished and this subtitle expires September 6 1, 2029 [2017].

SECTION 6. Section 552.006, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

10 (b) The training program must provide the person with 11 information regarding:

12 (1) the law governing the board's operations;

13 (2) [this subtitle and] the programs, functions, 14 rules, and budget of the board;

15 (3) the scope of and limitations on the rulemaking 16 <u>authority of the board;</u>

17 <u>(4)</u> [<del>(2)</del>] the results of the most recent formal audit 18 of the board;

(5) [<del>(3)</del>] the requirements of<u>:</u>

20 <u>(A)</u> laws relating to open meetings, public 21 information, administrative procedure, and <u>disclosing</u> conflicts of 22 interest; and

(B) other laws applicable to members of the board
 in performing their duties; and
 (6) [(4)] any applicable ethics policies adopted by
 the board or the Texas Ethics Commission.

27 (d) The executive director shall create a training manual

1 that includes the information required by Subsection (b). The executive director shall distribute a copy of the training manual 2 annually to each board member. On receipt of the training manual, 3 each board member shall sign and submit to the executive director a 4 statement acknowledging receipt of the training manual. The board 5 shall publish a copy of each signed statement on the board's 6 7 Internet website. 8 SECTION 7. Section 553.003(b), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 9 10 (b) The executive director is a full-time employee of the board and shall: 11 12 (1) serve as secretary to the board; [and] perform the regular administrative functions of 13 (2) 14 the board and any other duty as the board directs; and 15 (3) under the direction of the board, perform the duties required by this subtitle or designated by the board. 16 17 SECTION 8. Subchapter A, Chapter 554, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 554.0011 to read as follows: 18 19 Sec. 554.0011. USE OF ALTERNATIVE RULEMAKING AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION. (a) The board shall develop a policy to encourage the 20 21 use of: (1) negotiated rulemaking procedures under Chapter 22 2008, Government Code, for the adoption of board rules; and 23 24 (2) appropriate alternative dispute resolution procedures under Chapter 2009, Government Code, to assist in the 25 26 resolution of internal and external disputes under the board's 27 jurisdiction.

No. 2561 (b) The board's procedures relating to alternative dispute 1 resolution must conform, to the extent possible, to any model 2 guidelines issued by the State Office of Administrative Hearings 3 for the use of alternative dispute resolution by state agencies. 4 5 (c) The board shall: 6 (1) coordinate the implementation of the policy 7 adopted under Subsection (a); 8 (2) provide training as needed to implement the procedures for negotiated rulemaking or alternative dispute 9 10 resolution; and (3) collect data concerning the effectiveness of those 11 12 procedures. SECTION 9. Section 558.051(a), Occupations Code, is amended 13 14 to read as follows: 15 (a) To qualify for a license to practice pharmacy, an applicant for licensing by examination must submit to the board: 16 17 (1) a license fee set by the board; and (2) a completed application on a form prescribed by 18 19 the board with satisfactory sworn evidence that the applicant: 20 (A) is at least 18 years of age; 21 (B) [is of good moral character; has completed a minimum of a 1,000-hour 2.2 [<del>(C)</del>] 23 internship or other program that has been approved by the board or 24 has demonstrated, to the board's satisfaction, experience in the practice of pharmacy that meets or exceeds the board's minimum 25 26 internship requirements; 27 (C) [<del>(D)</del>] has graduated and received а

No. 2561 professional practice degree, as defined by board rule, from an 1 accredited pharmacy degree program approved by the board; 2 3 (D) [(E)] has passed the examination required by the board; and 4 5 (E) [<del>(F)</del>] has not had a pharmacist license granted by another state restricted, suspended, revoked, 6 or surrendered, for any reason. 7 8 SECTION 10. Section 558.101(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 9 10 (a) To qualify for a license to practice pharmacy, an applicant for licensing by reciprocity must: 11 (1)submit to the board: 12 a reciprocity fee set by the board; and 13 (A) 14 (B) completed application in the form а 15 prescribed by the board, given under oath; (2) [be of good moral character; 16 17 [(3)] have graduated and received a professional practice degree, as defined by board rule, from an accredited 18 pharmacy degree program approved by the board; 19 (3) [<del>(4)</del>] have presented to the board: 20 21 (A) proof of current or initial licensing by examination; and 22 23 (B) proof that the current license and any other 24 license granted to the applicant by another state has not been restricted, suspended, revoked, or surrendered for any reason; and 25 26 (4) [<del>(5)</del>] pass the Texas Pharmacy Jurisprudence examination. 27

SECTION 11. Section 559.003, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

3 (f) The board may refuse to renew a license to practice
4 pharmacy for a license holder who is in violation of a board order.

5 SECTION 12. Section 568.002(c), Occupations Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 (c) An applicant for registration as a pharmacy technician
8 or a pharmacy technician trainee must[+

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[(1) be of good moral character; and

10 [(2)] submit an application on a form prescribed by 11 the board.

12 SECTION 13. Section 568.004, Occupations Code, is amended 13 to read as follows:

Sec. 568.004. RENEWAL OF REGISTRATION. (a) The board may adopt a system in which the registrations of pharmacy technicians and pharmacy technician trainees expire on various dates during the year.

18 (b) To renew a pharmacy technician registration, the 19 registrant must, before the expiration date of the registration: 20 (1) pay a renewal fee as determined by the board under 21 Section 568.005; and

22 (2) comply with the continuing education requirements
 23 prescribed by the board in accordance with Section 568.0045.

24 (c) A person whose pharmacy technician registration has
 25 been expired for 90 days or less may renew the expired registration
 26 by paying to the board a renewal fee that is equal to one and
 27 one-half times the normally required renewal fee for the

## 1 registration.

2 <u>(d) A person whose pharmacy technician registration has</u> 3 <u>been expired for more than 90 days but less than one year may renew</u> 4 <u>the expired registration by paying to the board a renewal fee that</u> 5 <u>is equal to two times the normally required renewal fee for the</u> 6 <u>registration.</u>

7 <u>(e) A person whose pharmacy technician registration has</u> 8 <u>been expired for one year or more may not renew the</u> 9 <u>registration. The person may register by complying with the</u> 10 <u>requirements and procedures for initially registering, including</u> 11 <u>the examination requirement.</u>

12(f) The board may refuse to renew a pharmacy technician13registration for a registrant who is in violation of a board order.

SECTION 14. Chapter 568, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 568.0045 to read as follows:

Sec. 568.0045. RULES RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION. The board shall adopt rules relating to the continuing education required for pharmacy technicians. The rules must include requirements for:

20 (1) the number of hours of continuing education;

SECTION 15. A pharmacist is not required to comply with a
 rule adopted under Section 481.0761(j), Health and Safety Code, as
 added by this Act, before January 1, 2018.

4 SECTION 16. Section 481.0763, Health and Safety Code, as 5 added by this Act, applies only to a pharmacist who dispenses a 6 controlled substance on or after January 1, 2018.

7 SECTION 17. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 8 this section, Section 552.006, Occupations Code, as amended by this 9 Act, applies to a member of the Texas State Board of Pharmacy 10 appointed before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

(b) A member of the Texas State Board of Pharmacy who, 11 before the effective date of this Act, completed the training 12 program required by Section 552.006, Occupations Code, as that law 13 14 existed before the effective date of this Act, is required to 15 complete additional training only on subjects added by this Act to the training program as required by Section 552.006, Occupations 16 17 Code, as amended by this Act. A board member described by this subsection may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a member in 18 19 attendance at a meeting of the board held on or after December 1, 2017, until the member completes the additional training. 20

21 SECTION 18. Sections 558.051, 558.101, and 568.002, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to an 22 23 application for a license to practice pharmacy or for registration 24 as a pharmacy technician or pharmacy technician trainee filed on or after the effective date of this Act. An application for a license 25 26 or registration filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was filed, 27

1 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

2 SECTION 19. Section 559.003, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, and Sections 568.004(b), (e), and (f), Occupations 3 Code, as added by this Act, apply only to the renewal of a license to 4 practice pharmacy or of a pharmacy technician registration on or 5 after the effective date of this Act. The renewal of a license or 6 registration before that date is governed by the law in effect 7 8 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 9

SECTION 20. As soon as practicable after the effective date 10 of this Act, the Texas State Board of Pharmacy shall adopt rules to 11 reduce the amount of the fees imposed by the board for the renewal 12 of an expired pharmacy technician registration to reflect the 13 14 amounts provided for by Sections 568.004(c) and (d), Occupations 15 Code, as added by this Act. A pharmacy technician who renews an expired registration certificate on or after the effective date of 16 17 this Act shall pay the amount provided for by Section 568.004(c) or (d), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, instead of the amount 18 19 provided for under board rules adopted before that date.

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SECTION 21. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
