2	relating to the elimination of fees for licensure under the Bingo
3	Enabling Act.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 2001, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 2001.003 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 2001.003. STATE FUNDING FROM BINGO PRIZES. It is the
8	intent of the legislature that the funding necessary for the
9	administration of this chapter by the commission be appropriated to
10	the commission out of money paid to the commission by bingo players
11	as bingo prize fees and transferred to the general revenue fund
12	under Section 2001.507(d).
13	SECTION 2. Section 2001.103(a), Occupations Code, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	(a) An authorized organization may receive a temporary
16	license to conduct bingo by filing with the commission an
17	application, on a form prescribed by the commission[, accompanied
18	by a \$25 license fee].
19	SECTION 3. Section 2001.105(a), Occupations Code, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	(a) The commission shall issue or renew a license to conduct
22	bingo [on payment of the license fee provided by Section 2001.104]
23	if the commission determines that:
24	(1) the member or members of the applicant designated

1 in the application to conduct bingo are active members of the 2 applicant;

3 (2) the bingo is to be conducted in accordance with4 this chapter;

5 (3) the proceeds of the bingo are to be disposed in6 accordance with this chapter;

7 (4) the applicant has made and can demonstrate 8 significant progress toward the accomplishment of the purposes of 9 the organization during the 12 months preceding the date of 10 application for a license or license renewal;

(5) all persons who will conduct, promote, or administer the proposed bingo are active members of the applicant organization and all other persons who will assist in conducting, promoting, or administering the proposed bingo games are persons authorized to do so by Section 2001.411; and

16 (6) no person under whose name bingo will be conducted 17 and no person working at the proposed bingo has been convicted of a 18 gambling offense or criminal fraud.

SECTION 4. Section 2001.154, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

21 Sec. 2001.154. INELIGIBLE PERSONS. (a) The commission may 22 not issue a commercial lessor license to or renew a commercial 23 lessor license of:

24 (1) a person convicted of criminal fraud or a gambling25 or gambling-related offense;

26 (2) a public officer who receives any consideration,
 27 direct or indirect, as owner or lessor of premises offered for

1 conducting bingo; 2 [a person who extends credit to, loans money to, or (3) 3 pays or provides for the payment of license fees for an authorized organization; 4 5 [(4)] a distributor or manufacturer; 6 (4) [(5)] a person in which a person covered by 7 Subdivision (1), (2), or (3)[, or (4)] or a person married or 8 related in the first degree by consanguinity or affinity, as determined under Chapter 573, Government Code, to one of those 9 persons has greater than a 10 percent proprietary, equitable, or 10 credit interest or in which one of those persons is active or 11 12 employed; (5) [(6)] a foreign corporation or other foreign legal 13 14 entity; 15 (6) [(7)] an individual who is not a resident of this 16 state; 17 (7) [(8)] a corporation or other legal entity owned or controlled by: 18 19 (A) a foreign corporation; or 20 an individual who is not a resident of this (B) state; or 21 (8) [(9)] a corporation or other legal entity: 22 whose shares are publicly traded; or 23 (A) 24 (B) owned or controlled by a corporation whose shares are publicly traded. 25 [(a)(5)] 26 (b) Subsection (a)(4) does not prevent an authorized organization or other person that is not organized for 27

1 pecuniary profit and no part of the net earnings of which inure to 2 the benefit of an individual, member, or shareholder from being 3 licensed as a commercial lessor solely because a public officer or a 4 person married or related in the first degree by consanguinity or 5 affinity to a public officer is a member of, active in, or employed 6 by the authorized organization or other person.

7 SECTION 5. Sections 2001.159(a) and (c), Occupations Code, 8 are amended to read as follows:

9 (a) The commission shall issue or renew a commercial lessor 10 license if the commission determines that:

11 (1) [the applicant has paid the license fee as 12 provided by Section 2001.158;

13 [(2)] the applicant qualifies to be licensed under 14 this chapter;

15 (2) [(3)] the rent to be charged is fair and 16 reasonable;

17 <u>(3)</u> [(4)] there is no diversion of the funds of the 18 proposed lessee from the lawful purposes under this chapter;

19 <u>(4)</u> [(5)] the person whose signature or name appears 20 in the application is in all respects the real party in interest and 21 is not an undisclosed agent or trustee for the real party in 22 interest; and

23 (5) [(6)] the applicant will lease the premises for
 24 the conduct of bingo in accordance with this chapter.

(c) <u>The</u> [Except as provided by Section 2001.158(d), the]
period may not exceed one year.

27 SECTION 6. Section 2001.304(a), Occupations Code, is

1 amended to read as follows:

2 (a) The commission shall issue a temporary authorization 3 for the activity requested if a license for the activity is not 4 issued or denied before the 31st day after the earliest date on 5 which each of the following has occurred:

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the filing of an application for the license;

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(2) [the payment of the proper license fee;

8 [(3)] the filing of a copy of a tax exemption statement 9 issued by the Internal Revenue Service under Section 501(c), 10 Internal Revenue Code of 1986, if required; and

11 (3) [(4)] the completion of a criminal background 12 investigation.

13 SECTION 7. Section 2001.306(a), Occupations Code, is 14 amended to read as follows:

(a) A license issued under this chapter may be amended on application to the commission [and on payment of a fee in the amount required by the commission] if the subject matter of the proposed amendment could properly have been included in the original license.

20 SECTION 8. Section 2001.315(a), Occupations Code, is 21 amended to read as follows:

(a) A person who fails to renew the person's license under
this chapter before the date the license expires may renew the
license after the expiration date by [+

25 [(1) filing a license renewal application with the 26 commission not later than the 14th day after the date the license 27 expires, paying the applicable annual license fee, and paying a

1 late license renewal fee equal to 10 percent of the annual license fee; or 2 3 $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$ filing a license renewal application with the commission not later than the 60th day after the date the license 4 5 expires[, paying the applicable annual license fee, and paying a late license renewal fee equal to 10 percent of the annual license 6 fee for each 14-day period occurring after the date the license 7 8 expires and before the date the renewal application is filed with the commission]. 9 SECTION 9. Section 10 2001.438(f), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 11 Each licensed authorized organization that is a member 12 (f) of the unit shall be jointly and severally liable for: 13 14 (1)compliance with the requirements of this 15 subchapter and the rules of the commission relating to the filing of 16 required reports; 17 (2) the maintenance of bingo inventory and financial records; and 18 (3) the payment of [fees and] any penalties imposed for 19 a violation of this subchapter or commission rules related to the 20 operations of the unit. 21 SECTION 10. Section 2001.458(a), Occupations Code, 22 is amended to read as follows: 23 24 (a) An item of expense may not be incurred or paid in connection with the conduct of bingo except an expense that is 25 26 reasonable or necessary to conduct bingo, including an expense for: 27 advertising, including the cost of printing bingo (1)

1	gift certificates;
2	<pre>(2) security;</pre>
3	(3) repairs to premises and equipment;
4	(4) bingo supplies and equipment;
5	(5) prizes;
6	(6) stated rental or mortgage and insurance expenses;
7	(7) bookkeeping, legal, or accounting services

9	(8) fees for bingo chairpersons, operators, managers,
10	salespersons, callers, cashiers, ushers, janitorial services, and
11	utility supplies and services;
12	(9) health insurance or health insurance benefits for

14	cashiers, and ushers, as provided by Subsection (b);
15	(10) [license fees;
16	[(11)] attending a bingo seminar or convention
17	required under Section 2001.107; and
18	(11) [(12)] debit card transaction fees and electronic
19	funds transfer fees.
20	SECTION 11. Section 2001.459(a), Occupations Code, is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	(a) The following items of expense incurred or paid in
23	connection with the conduct of bingo must be paid from an
24	organization's bingo account:
25	(1) advertising, including the cost of printing bingo
26	gift certificates;
27	(2) security during a bingo occasion;

(3) the purchase or repair of bingo supplies and
 equipment;
 (4) prizes, other than authorized cash prizes;
 (5) stated rental expenses;
 (6) bookkeeping, legal, or accounting services;

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6 (7) fees for callers, cashiers, and ushers; <u>and</u>

7 (8) janitorial services[; and

8 [(9) license fees].

9 SECTION 12. Sections 2001.104, 2001.158, 2001.205, 10 2001.209, 2001.214(b), 2001.306(a-1) and (e), 2001.313(b-2), and 11 2001.437(e), Occupations Code, are repealed.

SECTION 13. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to the issuance of a license under Chapter 2001, Occupations Code, that occurs on a date on or after the effective date of this Act. The issuance of a license that occurs on a date before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the license is issued, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

19 SECTION 14. Not later than January 1, 2018, the Texas 20 Lottery Commission shall return to each license holder who paid a 21 license fee under Chapter 2001, Occupations Code, before the 22 effective date of this Act, any portion of the fee attributable to 23 the license holder's period of licensure occurring on or after the 24 effective date of this Act.

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SECTION 15. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
