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H.B. No. 2637

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT 2 relating to authorization by the Texas Higher Education 3 Coordinating Board for certain public junior colleges to offer 4 baccalaureate degree programs.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 130.0012, Education Code, is amended by
amending Subsections (a), (b), and (e) and adding Subsections

(b-4), (b-5), (b-6), and (g-1) to read as follows:

9 (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board <u>may</u> 10 [shall] authorize public junior colleges to offer baccalaureate 11 degree programs in the fields of applied science, [and] applied 12 technology, <u>and nursing</u> under this section. Offering a 13 baccalaureate degree program under this section does not otherwise 14 alter the role and mission of a public junior college.

15 (b) The coordinating board:

16 (1) shall authorize baccalaureate degree programs at 17 each public junior college that previously participated in a pilot 18 project to offer baccalaureate degree programs; and

19 (2) may authorize baccalaureate degree programs at one
20 or more public junior colleges that offer a degree program in the
21 field of nursing and have demonstrated a workforce need.

22 (b-4) The coordinating board shall establish a pilot 23 project to examine the feasibility and effectiveness of authorizing 24 not more than two baccalaureate degree programs, one in the field of

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1 applied science or applied technology, and one in the field of nursing at a public junior college with a main campus located on a 2 barrier island and at a public junior college with not more than 3 three main campuses located in a county with a population greater 4 5 than 3.3 million. 6 (b-5) Not later than January 1, 2019, the coordinating board 7 shall prepare a progress report on the pilot project established under Subsection (b-4). Not later than January 1, 2021, the 8 coordinating board shall prepare a report on the effectiveness of 9 10 the pilot project, including any recommendations for legislative action regarding the offering of baccalaureate degree programs in 11 12 the fields of applied science, applied technology, and nursing by a public junior college. The coordinating board shall deliver a copy 13 of each report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the 14 15 speaker of the house of representatives, and the chair of the standing committee of each house of the legislature with primary 16 17 jurisdiction over higher education. Unless the authority to continue offering a baccalaureate degree program in the fields of 18 applied science, applied technology, and nursing is continued by 19 the legislature, a public junior college may not: 20 21 (1) enroll a new student in a baccalaureate degree 22 program under the pilot project after the 2022 fall semester; (2) offer junior-level or senior-level courses for 23 24 those degree programs after the 2025 fall semester, unless the 25 coordinating board authorizes the college to offer those courses; 26 or 27 (3) award a baccalaureate degree under the pilot

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1	project after the 2025 fall semester, unless the coordinating board
2	approves the awarding of the degree.
3	(b-6) This subsection and Subsections (b-4) and (b-5)
4	expire on the first December 31 following the first regular
5	legislative session that occurs after the sixth anniversary of the
6	date a public junior college offering a degree program in the fields
7	of applied science, applied technology, and nursing under
8	Subsection (b-4) meets the accreditation requirements of
9	Subsection (c).
10	(e) In determining what baccalaureate degree programs are
11	to be offered, the coordinating board shall consider the following
12	factors:
13	(1) the <u>workforce</u> need for the degree programs in the
14	region served by the junior college;
15	(2) how those degree programs would complement the
16	other programs and course offerings of the junior college <u>and</u>
17	whether the associate degree program offered by the junior college
18	in the same field has been successful;
19	(3) whether those degree programs would unnecessarily
20	duplicate the degree programs offered by other institutions of
21	higher education or whether a partnership with other institutions
22	of higher education is possible; [and]
23	(4) the ability of the junior college to support the
24	program with student enrollment and the adequacy of the junior
25	college's facilities, faculty, administration, libraries, and
26	other resources; and
27	(5) whether the junior college meets the taxable

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property valuation amount established in Section 130.032. 1 2 (g-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (g), a degree program established under Subsection (b-4) may be funded solely by a public 3 4 junior college's proportionate share of state appropriations under Section 130.003, local funds, and private sources. This subsection 5 6 expires January 1, 2022. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10

11 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
