## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to an alert for a missing senior citizen or person with 3 Alzheimer's disease. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter M, Chapter 411, 5 Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER M. SILVER ALERT FOR MISSING SENIOR CITIZENS AND PERSONS 7 WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE 8 SECTION 2. Sections 411.381(1) and (2), Government Code, 9 are amended to read as follows: 10 11 (1)"Alert" means the statewide silver alert for 12 missing senior citizens and persons with Alzheimer's disease, as developed and implemented under this subchapter. 13 14 (2) "Local law enforcement agency" means a local law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of a 15 16 missing senior citizen or person with Alzheimer's disease. SECTION 3. Section 411.382, Government Code, is amended to 17 read as follows: 18 Sec. 411.382. SILVER ALERT FOR MISSING SENIOR CITIZENS AND 19 PERSONS WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE. With the cooperation of the 20 Texas Department of Transportation, the office of the governor, and 21 other appropriate law enforcement agencies in this state, the 22 23 department shall develop and implement a statewide silver alert to be activated on behalf of a missing senior citizen or person with 24

2 SECTION 4. Section 411.383(b), Government Code, is amended 3 to read as follows:

4 (b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as
5 necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert. The rules
6 and directives must include:

8 enforcement agency to verify whether <u>a person reported missing is</u> a

16 citizen <u>or person with Alzheimer's disease</u> to the department; and

17 (3) the procedures to be used by an individual or 18 entity to report information about a missing senior citizen <u>or</u> 19 <u>person with Alzheimer's disease</u> to designated media outlets in 20 Texas.

21 SECTION 5. Section 411.386, Government Code, is amended to 22 read as follows:

Sec. 411.386. NOTIFICATION TO DEPARTMENT OF MISSING SENIOR
CITIZEN <u>OR PERSON WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE</u>. (a) A local law
enforcement agency may notify the department if the agency:

No. 2639 1 (2) verifies that at the time the senior citizen or person with Alzheimer's disease is reported missing: 2 3 (A) the person reported missing: 4 (i) is 65 years of age or older and has an 5 impaired mental condition; or 6 (ii) is a person with Alzheimer's disease; 7 and 8 (B) the person's [senior citizen's] location is unknown; and 9 10 [(C) the senior citizen has an impaired mental condition; and] 11 12 (3) determines that the person's [senior citizen's] disappearance poses a credible threat to the person's [senior 13 14 citizen's] health and safety. 15 (b) The local law enforcement agency shall: 16 require the family or legal guardian of the (1)17 missing senior citizen or person with Alzheimer's disease to provide documentation of the person's age and [senior citizen's 18 impaired mental] condition to verify the person's status 19 [condition] as described [required] by Subsection (a)(2)(A) 20 [(a)(2)(C)]; and 21 (2) as soon as practicable, determine whether the 22 person's [senior citizen's] disappearance poses a credible threat 23 24 to the person's [senior citizen's] health and safety for purposes of Subsection (a)(3). 25 SECTION 6. Section 411.387(b), Government Code, is amended 26 27 to read as follows:

(b) In issuing the alert, the department shall send the alert to designated media outlets in Texas. Following receipt of the alert, participating radio stations <u>and</u>[7] television stations[7] and other <u>participating</u> media outlets may issue the alert at designated intervals to assist in locating the missing senior citizen <u>or person with Alzheimer's disease</u>.

7 SECTION 7. Section 411.388, Government Code, is amended to 8 read as follows:

9 Sec. 411.388. CONTENT OF SILVER ALERT. The alert must 10 include:

(1) all appropriate information that is provided by the local law enforcement agency and that may lead to the safe recovery of the missing senior citizen <u>or person with Alzheimer's</u> <u>disease;</u> and

(2) a statement instructing any person with
information related to the missing senior citizen <u>or person with</u>
Alzheimer's disease to contact a local law enforcement agency.

SECTION 8. Section 411.389, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

20 Sec. 411.389. TERMINATION OF SILVER ALERT. (a) The 21 director shall terminate any activation of the alert with respect 22 to a particular missing senior citizen <u>or person with Alzheimer's</u> 23 <u>disease</u> not later than the earlier of the date on which:

(1) the missing <u>person</u> [senior citizen] is located or
 25 the situation is otherwise resolved; or

26 (2) the notification period ends, as determined by27 department rule.

1 (b) A local law enforcement agency that locates a missing 2 senior citizen <u>or person with Alzheimer's disease</u> who is the 3 subject of an alert under this subchapter shall notify the 4 department as soon as possible that the missing <u>person</u> [<del>senior</del> 5 <del>citizen</del>] has been located.

6 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
