2 relating to the prosecution of the offense of unlawful transfer of a

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 46.06, Penal Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (e) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) A person commits an offense if the person:
- 9 (1) sells, rents, leases, loans, or gives a handgun to
- 10 any person knowing that the person to whom the handgun is to be
- 11 delivered intends to use it unlawfully or in the commission of an
- 12 unlawful act;
- 13 (2) intentionally or knowingly sells, rents, leases,
- 14 or gives or offers to sell, rent, lease, or give to any child
- 15 younger than 18 years any firearm, club, or illegal knife;
- 16 (3) intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly sells a
- 17 firearm or ammunition for a firearm to any person who is
- 18 intoxicated;
- 19 (4) knowingly sells a firearm or ammunition for a
- 20 firearm to any person who has been convicted of a felony before the
- 21 fifth anniversary of the later of the following dates:
- (A) the person's release from confinement
- 23 following conviction of the felony; or
- 24 (B) the person's release from supervision under

- 1 community supervision, parole, or mandatory supervision following
- 2 conviction of the felony;
- 3 (5) sells, rents, leases, loans, or gives a handgun to
- 4 any person knowing that an active protective order is directed to
- 5 the person to whom the handgun is to be delivered; [or]
- 6 (6) knowingly purchases, rents, leases, or receives as
- 7 a loan or gift from another a handgun while an active protective
- 8 order is directed to the actor; or
- 9 (7) knowingly sells, rents, leases, loans, or gives a
- 10 firearm to a person who the actor knows, or has reasonable cause to
- 11 believe, is:
- (A) a person receiving inpatient mental health
- 13 services by order of a court under Chapter 574, Health and Safety
- 14 Code;
- 15 (B) a person who has been acquitted in a criminal
- 16 case by reason of insanity or lack of mental responsibility,
- 17 regardless of whether the person was ordered by a court to receive
- 18 inpatient treatment or residential care under Chapter 46C, Code of
- 19 Criminal Procedure;
- (C) a person who has been determined to have an
- 21 <u>intellectual disability and committed by a court for long-term</u>
- 22 placement in a residential care facility under Chapter 593, Health
- 23 <u>and Safety Code;</u>
- 24 (D) an incapacitated adult for whom a court has
- 25 appointed a guardian of the person under Title 3, Estates Code,
- 26 based on a determination that the person lacks the mental capacity
- 27 to manage the person's affairs; or

- 1 (E) a person determined to be incompetent to
- 2 stand trial under Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 3 (e) It is a defense to prosecution under Subsection (a)(7)
- 4 that the transfer is to a person who:
- 5 (1) is the subject of a judicial order or finding that
- 6 the person is no longer an incapacitated adult or is entitled to
- 7 relief from disabilities under Section 574.088, Health and Safety
- 8 Code; or
- 9 (2) has obtained notice of relief from disabilities
- 10 under 18 U.S.C. Section 925.
- 11 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 12 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 14 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 15 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 16 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 17 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 18 before that date.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
