A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to a study on the use of portable testing equipment to
- 3 identify synthetic drugs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Abusable synthetic substance" has the meaning
- 7 assigned by Section 484.001, Health and Safety Code.
- 8 (2) "Synthetic controlled substance" means a
- 9 substance listed in Penalty Group 2-A under Section 481.1031,
- 10 Health and Safety Code.
- 11 (3) "Synthetic drug" means an abusable synthetic
- 12 substance or a synthetic controlled substance.
- 13 (4) "Task force" means the Task Force on Synthetic
- 14 Drug Testing created under this Act.
- SECTION 2. TASK FORCE; MEMBERSHIP. (a) The Task Force on
- 16 Synthetic Drug Testing is created to investigate the use of
- 17 portable testing devices for identification of synthetic drugs.
- 18 (b) The task force consists of nine members, appointed as
- 19 follows:
- 20 (1) one member appointed by the commissioner of the
- 21 Texas Commission on Law Enforcement;
- 22 (2) one member appointed by the public safety director
- 23 of the Department of Public Safety;
- 24 (3) one member appointed by the attorney general;

- 1 (4) two members appointed by the governor;
- 2 (5) two members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
- 3 and
- 4 (6) two members appointed by the speaker of the house
- 5 of representatives.
- 6 (c) The members of the task force shall elect a presiding
- 7 officer from among the membership.
- 8 (d) Members of the task force serve without compensation and
- 9 may not be reimbursed for travel or other expenses incurred while
- 10 conducting the business of the task force.
- 11 (e) The task force shall meet at the call of the presiding
- 12 officer. The task force may meet telephonically in accordance with
- 13 Section 551.125(b)(3), Government Code.
- 14 SECTION 3. STUDY; REPORT. (a) The task force shall conduct a
- 15 study on equipping law enforcement officers with portable testing
- 16 devices capable of identifying an unidentified substance as a
- 17 synthetic drug.
- 18 (b) The study must address:
- 19 (1) the accuracy of portable testing devices;
- 20 (2) the cost of portable testing devices;
- 21 (3) the admissibility in court of results of portable
- 22 testing devices; and
- 23 (4) any upgrades that would be needed to keep up with
- 24 the pace at which synthetic drugs are chemically modified.
- 25 (c) Not later than December 1, 2018, the task force shall
- 26 submit to the legislature a report on the feasibility and
- 27 desirability of equipping law enforcement officers with portable

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- 1 testing devices. The report submitted under this subsection must
- 2 include any legislative recommendations by the task force.
- 3 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires and the task force
- 4 is abolished September 1, 2019.
- 5 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 6 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 7 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 8 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 9 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
