A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a firearm buyback program administered by certain local
- 3 law enforcement agencies.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 11, Local Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Chapter 364 to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 364. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FIREARM BUYBACK PROGRAMS
- 8 Sec. 364.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "local law
- 9 enforcement agency" means a municipal police department or
- 10 sheriff's department.
- 11 Sec. 364.002. FIREARM BUYBACK PROGRAM. A firearm buyback
- 12 program is a program under which a local law enforcement agency
- 13 seeks to reduce violence or crime in the community by offering a
- 14 payment as an incentive for each firearm surrendered to the agency.
- Sec. 364.003. SURRENDER OF FIREARM. (a) A person may
- 16 surrender a firearm to any local law enforcement agency in this
- 17 state.
- 18 (b) A person who surrenders a firearm under this section is
- 19 not subject to prosecution for the possession of the firearm.
- Sec. 364.004. MONETARY INCENTIVES. A local law enforcement
- 21 agency shall pay \$100 to the surrendering person for each firearm
- 22 surrendered under this chapter.
- Sec. 364.005. RETENTION AND RETURN OF FIREARM. (a) A local
- 24 law enforcement agency that receives a firearm surrendered under

- 1 this chapter may not dispose of the firearm under Section 364.006
- 2 before the 30th day after the date the firearm is surrendered.
- 3 (b) The local <u>law enforcement agency shall return the</u>
- 4 firearm to the owner of the firearm if the owner:
- 5 (1) shows documentation that the owner lawfully owns
- 6 the firearm;
- 7 (2) attests that the owner did not authorize the
- 8 surrender of the firearm; and
- 9 (3) remits to the agency reimbursement for the \$100
- 10 paid to the person who surrendered the firearm.
- 11 Sec. 364.006. DISPOSITION OF SURRENDERED FIREARMS. (a) A
- 12 local law enforcement agency may retain a surrendered firearm as
- 13 evidence of an offense other than possession of a firearm.
- 14 (b) If a firearm is surrendered under this chapter and not
- 15 retained as evidence, the local law enforcement agency shall
- 16 <u>destroy the firearm.</u>
- 17 Sec. 364.007. REIMBURSEMENT BY COMPTROLLER. (a) A local
- 18 law enforcement agency may monthly submit to the comptroller of
- 19 public accounts an invoice for amounts paid for firearms
- 20 surrendered under the firearm buyback program on a form adopted by
- 21 the comptroller.
- (b) Not later than the fifth working day after the date the
- 23 comptroller receives the invoice, the comptroller shall reimburse
- 24 the local law enforcement agency.
- 25 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
