## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a system of care framework for certain minors receiving
- 3 mental health services.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 531.251, Government Code, is reenacted
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 531.251. TEXAS SYSTEM OF CARE FRAMEWORK. (a) In this
- 8 section:
- 9 (1) "Minor" means an individual younger than 18 years
- 10 of age.
- 11 (2) "Serious emotional disturbance" means a mental,
- 12 behavioral, or emotional disorder of sufficient duration to result
- 13 in functional impairment that substantially interferes with or
- 14 limits a person's role or ability to function in family, school, or
- 15 community activities.
- 16 (3) "System of care framework" means a framework for
- 17 collaboration among state agencies, minors who have a serious
- 18 emotional disturbance or are at risk of developing a serious
- 19 emotional disturbance, and the families of those minors that
- 20 improves access to services and delivers effective community-based
- 21 services that are family-driven, youth- or young adult-guided, and
- 22 culturally and linguistically competent.
- 23 (b) The commission shall implement a system of care
- 24 framework to develop local mental health systems of care in

- 1 communities for minors who are receiving residential mental health
- 2 services and supports or inpatient mental health hospitalization,
- 3 have or are at risk of developing a serious emotional disturbance,
- 4 or are at risk of being removed from the minor's home and placed in a
- 5 more restrictive environment to receive mental health services and
- 6 supports, including an inpatient mental health hospital, a
- 7 residential treatment facility, or a facility or program operated
- 8 by the Department of Family and Protective Services or an agency
- 9 that is part of the juvenile justice system.
- 10 (c) The commission shall:
- 11 (1) maintain a comprehensive plan for the delivery of
- 12 mental health services and supports to a minor and a minor's family
- 13 using a system of care framework, including best practices in the
- 14 financing, administration, governance, and delivery of those
- 15 services;
- 16 (2) enter memoranda of understanding with the
- 17 Department of State Health Services, the Department of Family and
- 18 Protective Services, the Texas Education Agency, the Texas Juvenile
- 19 Justice Department, and the Texas Correctional Office on Offenders
- 20 with Medical or Mental Impairments that specify the roles and
- 21 responsibilities of each agency in implementing the comprehensive
- 22 plan described by Subdivision (1);
- 23 (3) identify appropriate local, state, and federal
- 24 funding sources to finance infrastructure and mental health
- 25 services and supports needed to support state and local system of
- 26 care framework efforts;
- 27 (4) develop an evaluation system to measure

- 1 cross-system performance and outcomes of state and local system of
- 2 care framework efforts; and
- 3 (5) in implementing the provisions of this section,
- 4 consult with stakeholders, including:
- 5 (A) minors who have or are at risk of developing a
- 6 serious emotional disturbance or young adults who received mental
- 7 health services and supports as a minor with or at risk of
- 8 developing a serious emotional disturbance; and
- 9 (B) family members of those minors or young
- 10 adults.
- 11 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 12 of this Act, the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 13 implement the system of care framework and perform other actions
- 14 corresponding with the system of care framework as required by
- 15 Section 531.251, Government Code, as reenacted by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
