A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT relating to the participation of an advanced practice nurse as a primary care provider for certain governmental and other health benefit plans. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 533.005, Government Code, is amended by adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows: (d) For purposes of Subsection (a)(13) and subject to 8 9 Subsection (e), an advanced practice nurse, including an advanced practice nurse certified as a psychiatric/mental health advanced 10 practice nurse, may be included as a primary care provider in a 11 managed care organization's provider network regardless of whether 12 the physician delegating to or supervising the advanced practice 13 14 nurse under Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code, is in the provider network. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, including Sections 843.312 and 1301.052, Insurance Code, the executive 9 10 commissioner shall adopt rules to require a managed care organization or other entity to ensure that advanced practice 11 12 registered nurses and physician assistants are available as primary care providers in the organization's or entity's provider network. 13 14 The rules must require advanced practice registered nurses and 15 physician assistants to be treated in the same manner as primary care physicians with regard to: 16 17 (1) selection and assignment primary as care providers; 18 19 (2) inclusion as primary care providers in the provider network; and 20 21 (3) inclusion as primary care providers in any provider network directory maintained by the organization or 22 23 entity. 24 (b) For purposes of Subsection (a) and subject to Subsection (c), an advanced practice nurse, including an advanced practice 25 26 nurse certified as a psychiatric/mental health advanced practice nurse, may be included as a primary care provider in a managed care 27

If an advanced practice registered nurse is included 7 8 as a primary care provider under this subsection, the physician delegating to or supervising the advanced practice registered nurse 9 is included in the directory for purposes of supervision. CONTRACTS WITH ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSES. 5 (a) This section applies only to an advanced practice nurse 6 practicing in a county: 7 (1) in which there are no practicing physicians; and 8 (2) <u>that</u>: 9 (A) has been designated as a medically 10 underserved area under state and federal law; or 11 (B) contains a medically underserved population. 12 (b) A health maintenance organization may contract directly with an advanced practice nurse to provide health care services on 13 14 behalf of the health maintenance organization regardless of whether 15 the physician delegating to or supervising the advanced practice nurse under Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code, provides 16 17 health care services for the health maintenance organization. (c) If a health maintenance organization contracts directly 18 19 with an advanced practice nurse under Subsection (b), the physician delegating to or supervising the advanced practice nurse is part of 20 an applicable limited provider network for purposes of supervision. 21 (d) This section may not be construed as authorizing a 22 health maintenance organization to supervise or control the 23 24 practice of medicine as prohibited by Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code. 25 26 SECTION 5. Sec. 1301.0525. DESIGNATION OF ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSES AS 1 PREFERRED PROVIDERS. (a) This section applies only to an advanced 2 3 practice nurse practicing in a county: 4 (1) in which there are no practicing physicians; and (2) that: 5 6 (A) has been designated as a medically 7 underserved area under state and federal law; or 8 (B) contains a medically underserved population. 9 (b) An insurer offering a preferred provider benefit plan may designate an advanced practice nurse as a preferred provider 10 regardless of whether the physician delegating to or supervising 11 12 the advanced practice nurse under Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code, is a preferred provider. 13 14 (c) If an insurer designates an advanced practice nurse as a 15 preferred provider under Subsection (b), the physician delegating to or supervising the advanced practice nurse is a preferred 16 17 provider for purposes of supervision. (d) This section may not be construed as authorizing an 18 insurer to supervise or control the practice of medicine as 19 prohibited by Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code. 20 21 SECTION 6. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a 22 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, 23

the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is granted.
