- 4 SECTION 1. Section 1304.003(a), Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:

- 7 (1) "Identity recovery" means a process, through a
- 8 limited power of attorney and the assistance of an identity
- 9 recovery expert, that returns the identity of an identity theft
- 10 victim to pre-identity theft event status.
- 11 (2) "Service contract" means an agreement that is
- 12 entered into for a separately stated consideration and for a
- 13 specified term under which a provider agrees to:
- 14 (A) repair, replace, or maintain a product, or
- 15 provide indemnification for the repair, replacement, or
- 16 maintenance of a product, for operational or structural failure or
- 17 damage caused by a defect in materials or workmanship or by normal
- 18 wear; [or]
- 19 (B) provide identity recovery, if the service
- 20 contract is financed under Chapter 348 or 353, Finance Code; or
- (C) provide compensation to the buyer of a
- 22 vehicle on the total constructive loss under a depreciation benefit
- 23 optional member program.
- 24 (3) "Depreciation benefit optional member program"

- 1 means a service contract financed under Chapter 348 or 353, Finance
- 2 Code, that pays to the buyer, as a credit toward the purchase of a
- 3 replacement vehicle at a participating dealer, an amount less than
- 4 or equal to the difference between the purchase price and actual
- 5 <u>cash value for a total constructive loss.</u>
- 6 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 7 a depreciation benefit optional member program service contract
- 8 entered into or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 9 A depreciation benefit optional member program service contract
- 10 entered into or renewed before the effective date of this Act is
- 11 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 12 of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
