- address of the nearest local mental health authority; and 17

- Internet website home page to the web page described by Subdivision 19

- 21 (d) Not later than August 1 of each year, the president or
- the president's designee of an institution to which this section 22
- applies shall certify to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating 23
- Board the institution's compliance with this section. 24
