5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 42A, Code of Criminal Procedure, is

8 <u>SUBCHAPTER H-1. VETERANS REEMPLOYMENT PROGRAM</u>

amended by adding Subchapter H-1 to read as follows:

- 9 <u>Art. 42A.381. VETERANS REEMPLOYMENT PROGRAM.</u> In this
 10 <u>subchapter "veterans reemployment program" means a program that</u>
 11 <u>provides education and training to veterans with the goal that the</u>
 12 <u>veterans become gainfully employed.</u>
- Art. 42A.382. ELIGIBILITY. (a) A defendant placed on deferred adjudication community supervision for or convicted of a misdemeanor offense is eligible to participate in a veterans reemployment program established under this subchapter if the defendant is a veteran of the United States armed forces, including a member of the reserves, national guard, or state guard.
- 19 (b) The judge granting community supervision to a defendant
 20 described by Subsection (a) shall inform the defendant of the
 21 defendant's eligibility for the program but may not require the
 22 defendant to participate in the program.
- 23 <u>(c) A judge may additionally impose any condition of</u> 24 community supervision that the judge is authorized to impose under

- 1 this chapter on a defendant who chooses to participate in the
- 2 program under this subchapter.
- 3 Art. 42A.383. EDUCATION AND TRAINING COURSES. (a) A
- 4 participant in the program shall diligently attend workforce
- 5 development education and training courses developed or approved by
- 6 the Texas Workforce Commission under Chapter 316, Labor Code, as
- 7 directed by the court.
- 8 (b) The education and training courses under this article
- 9 must focus on providing a participant with useful workplace skills
- 10 most likely to lead to gainful employment by the participant.
- 11 (c) The education and training courses may be
- 12 individualized based on any physical or intellectual limitations of
- 13 the participant.
- 14 Art. 42A.384. FEE. (a) A fee may be assessed for
- 15 participation in the education and training courses in an amount
- 16 sufficient to cover the cost of providing the courses.
- 17 (b) If the court determines the defendant is indigent, the
- 18 court may reduce or waive the fee.
- 19 Art. 42A.385. COMPLETION OF PROGRAM. A participant
- 20 successfully completes the veterans reemployment program if the
- 21 participant completes the education and training courses required
- 22 by the court and:
- (1) obtains employment and retains that employment for
- 24 three continuous months;
- 25 (2) diligently searches for employment for a
- 26 continuous period of six months; or
- 27 (3) is determined by the court to be unemployable

- 1 because of a disability.
- 2 Art. 42A.386. FAILURE TO COMPLETE PROGRAM. (a) The judge
- 3 may not revoke the community supervision of a defendant who fails to
- 4 complete the program under this subchapter.
- 5 (b) If the defendant fails to complete the program under
- 6 this subchapter, the judge may:
- 7 (1) modify the defendant's conditions of community
- 8 supervision; and
- 9 (2) extend the period of community supervision so that
- 10 the defendant may comply with the conditions under Subdivision (1).
- 11 SECTION 2. Subchapter E-1, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 411.0729 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 411.0729. PROCEDURE FOR CERTAIN VETERANS. On
- 14 successful completion of the veterans reemployment program created
- 15 under Subchapter H-1, Chapter 42A, Code of Criminal Procedure, and
- 16 all other conditions of the defendant's community supervision,
- 17 regardless of whether the defendant meets the eligibility criteria
- 18 under this subchapter, after notice to the state and a hearing on
- 19 whether issuance of an order of nondisclosure is in the best
- 20 <u>interest of justice</u>, the court shall enter an order of
- 21 nondisclosure with respect to all records of the offense for which
- 22 the defendant was convicted or placed on deferred adjudication
- 23 <u>community supervision.</u>
- SECTION 3. Subtitle B, Title 4, Labor Code, is amended by
- 25 adding Chapter 316 to read as follows:
- 26 CHAPTER 316. VETERANS REEMPLOYMENT EDUCATION AND TRAINING COURSES
- Sec. 316.001. VETERANS REEMPLOYMENT PROGRAM. In this

- 1 chapter "veterans reemployment program" means the community
- 2 supervision program created under Subchapter H-1, Chapter 42A, Code
- 3 of Criminal Procedure.
- 4 Sec. 316.002. EDUCATION AND TRAINING COURSES. (a) The
- 5 commission shall develop or approve education and training courses
- 6 to assist veterans convicted of or placed on deferred adjudication
- 7 community supervision for a misdemeanor offense under Subchapter
- 8 H-1, Chapter 42A, Code of Criminal Procedure, in obtaining
- 9 workforce skills and becoming gainfully employed.
- 10 (b) The education and training courses must provide
- 11 instruction in workforce skills appropriate for veterans with
- 12 disabilities.
- SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2018, the Texas
- 14 Workforce Commission shall develop or approve education and
- 15 training courses as required under Chapter 316, Labor Code, as
- 16 added by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. Subchapter H-1, Chapter 42A, Code of Criminal
- 18 Procedure, applies only to a person placed on community
- 19 supervision, including deferred adjudication community
- 20 supervision, on or after January 1, 2018.
- 21 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
