A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the towing of unauthorized or unattended vehicles on a
- 3 parking facility.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2308.002, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Subdivision (5-b) and amending Subdivision (13) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (5-b) "Multiunit complex" has the meaning assigned by
- 9 Section 92.151, Property Code.
- 10 (13) "Unauthorized vehicle" means a vehicle parked,
- 11 stored, or located on a parking facility without the consent of the
- 12 parking facility owner. The term includes a vehicle parked on the
- 13 parking facility of a multiunit complex in violation of the parking
- 14 rules or policies of the multiunit complex.
- 15 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 2308.205, Occupations
- 16 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 2308.205. TOWING OF [STORAGE OF TOWED] VEHICLES TO
- 18 LICENSED VEHICLE STORAGE FACILITIES OR OTHER LOCATIONS ON CERTAIN
- 19 PARKING FACILITIES.
- SECTION 3. Section 2308.205, Occupations Code, is amended
- 21 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 22 follows:
- 23 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1), a [A] towing
- 24 company that makes a nonconsent tow shall tow the vehicle to a

- 1 vehicle storage facility that is operated by a person who holds a
- 2 license to operate the facility under Chapter 2303, unless the
- 3 towing company agrees to take the vehicle to a location designated
- 4 by the vehicle's owner.
- 5 (a-1) A towing company that makes a nonconsent tow from the
- 6 parking facility of a multiunit complex may tow the vehicle to
- 7 <u>another location on the same parking facility under the direction</u>
- 8 of:
- 9 (1) the parking facility owner;
- 10 (2) a parking facility authorized agent; or
- 11 <u>(3) a peace officer.</u>
- SECTION 4. Sections 2308.251(a) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 13 are amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) A person [The owner or operator of a vehicle] may not
- 15 leave unattended on a parking facility a vehicle that:
- 16 (1) is in or obstructs a vehicular traffic aisle,
- 17 entry, or exit of the parking facility;
- 18 (2) prevents a vehicle from exiting a parking space in
- 19 the facility;
- 20 (3) is in or obstructs a fire lane marked according to
- 21 Subsection (c);
- 22 (4) does not display the special license plates issued
- 23 under Section 504.201, Transportation Code, or the disabled parking
- 24 placard issued under Chapter 681, Transportation Code, for a
- 25 vehicle transporting a disabled person and is in a parking space
- 26 that is designated for the exclusive use of a vehicle transporting a
- 27 disabled person; [or]

- 1 (5) is leaking a fluid that presents a hazard or threat
- 2 to persons or property; or
- 3 (6) is parked on the parking facility of a multiunit
- 4 complex in violation of the parking rules or policies of the
- 5 multiunit complex.
- 6 (c) If a government regulation governing the marking of a
- 7 fire lane applies to a parking facility, a fire lane in the parking
- 8 facility must be marked as provided by the regulation. If a
- 9 government regulation on the marking of a fire lane does not apply
- 10 to the parking facility, all curbs of fire lanes must be painted red
- 11 and be conspicuously and legibly marked with the warning "FIRE
- 12 LANE--TOW AWAY ZONE" in white letters at least three inches tall, at
- 13 intervals not exceeding 50 feet.
- SECTION 5. Sections 2308.253(c), (d), and (e), Occupations
- 15 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 16 (c) A parking facility owner may not have an emergency
- 17 vehicle described by Section 2308.251(b) towed [removed] from the
- 18 parking facility.
- 19 (d) Except as provided by a contract described by Subsection
- 20 (e), a parking facility owner may not have a vehicle towed [removed]
- 21 from the parking facility merely because the vehicle does not
- 22 display an unexpired license plate or registration insignia issued
- 23 for the vehicle under Chapter 502, Transportation Code, or the
- 24 vehicle registration law of another state or country.
- (e) A contract provision providing for the towing [removal]
- 26 from a parking facility of a vehicle that does not display an
- 27 unexpired license plate or registration insignia is valid only if

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   the provision requires the owner or operator of the vehicle to be
   given at least 10 days' written notice that the vehicle will be

    towed from the parking facility at the vehicle owner's or operator's
    expense if it is not removed from the parking facility. The notice

                     (A) that the vehicle does not display an

    unexpired license plate or registration insignia;

   of the owner or operator of the vehicle if the vehicle does not

    a day to enable the owner or operator of the vehicle to locate the

                     (A) [\frac{1}{1}] delivered in person to the owner or
    operator of the vehicle; [or]
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17 18 (B) $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$ sent by certified mail, return receipt 19 requested, to that owner or operator; or 20 (C) attached: 21 (i) to the vehicle's front windshield; 22 (ii) to the vehicle's driver's side window; 23 or 24 (iii) if the vehicle has no 25 windshield or driver's side window, to a conspicuous part of the 26 vehicle. SECTION 6. Section 2308.253(e), Occupations Code, 27 as

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- 1 amended by this Act, applies only to a contract, including a lease
- 2 or rental agreement, entered into on or after the effective date of
- 3 this Act. A contract entered into before that date is governed by
- 4 the law in effect on the date the contract was entered into, and the
- 5 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2018.
