5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 121.002(1), Human Resources Code, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	(1) "Assistance animal" and "service animal" mean a
9	canine that is specially trained or equipped to <u>do work or perform</u>
10	tasks to help a person with a disability and that is used by a person
11	with a disability.
12	SECTION 2. Section 121.006, Human Resources Code, is
13	amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to
14	read as follows:
15	(a) A person <u>commits an offense if the person:</u>
16	(1) claims an animal is an assistance animal or
17	service animal when the animal is not an assistance animal or
18	service animal; or
19	(2) fits an [ <del>who uses a service</del> ] animal with a harness <u>,</u>
20	collar, vest, sign, tag, [ <del>or</del> ] leash <u>, or other form of</u>
21	identification of the type commonly used by persons with
22	disabilities who use assistance animals or service animals, or by
23	persons who train assistance animals or service animals, so that
24	the person may gain access, permission, or benefits provided to

persons with disabilities who use assistance animals or service animals by representing [trained animals, in order to represent] that the [his or her] animal is a specially trained assistance animal or service animal when training has not in fact been and is not being provided.

6 (a-1) An offense under Subsection (a) [7] is [guilty of] a
7 misdemeanor punishable [and on conviction shall be punished] by:

8

(1) a fine of not more than \$300; and

9 (2) 30 hours of community service to be performed for a 10 governmental entity or nonprofit organization that primarily 11 serves persons with visual impairments or other disabilities, or 12 for another entity or organization at the discretion of the court, 13 to be completed in not more than one year.

14 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 15 121.006, Human Resources Code, apply only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed 16 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in 17 effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is 18 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, 19 an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if 20 any element of the offense occurred before that date. 21
