## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study and report regarding shortages in certain 3 health professions. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 61.0669 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 61.0669. STUDY ON SHORTAGES IN CERTAIN HEALTH PROFESSIONS. (a) Subject to the availability of funds, the board 8 9 shall conduct a study in collaboration with the Texas Health Professions Resource Center, the Texas Center for Nursing Workforce 10 Studies, and the Texas Demographic Center to identify statewide and 11 regional shortages in health professions, with an emphasis on 12 shortages in doctoral-level training in those health professions. 13 14 The board shall develop an inventory of existing health science education programs and shall note the enrollment capacity for each 15 of those programs. The study must include an analysis of shortages 16 in the following health professions for which doctoral-level 17 training is offered: 18 (1) medicine, including a doctor of medicine degree 19 (M.D.) and a doctor of osteopathic medicine degree (D.O.); 20 21 (2) nursing, including a doctor of philosophy degree and a doctor of nursing practice degree; 22 23 (3) physical therapy, including a doctor of philosophy 24 degree and a doctor of physical therapy degree;

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1	(4) occupational therapy, including a doctor of
2	philosophy degree and a doctor of occupational therapy degree;
3	(5) audiology, including a doctor of philosophy degree
4	and a doctor of audiology degree;
5	(6) psychology, including a doctor of philosophy
6	degree and a doctor of psychology degree;
7	(7) pharmacy, including a doctor of philosophy degree
8	and a doctor of pharmacy degree; and
9	(8) public health, including a doctor of philosophy
10	degree and a doctor of public health degree.
11	(b) The board shall make recommendations regarding the
12	establishment of new programs and expansion of existing programs to
13	meet the increased need for health professionals in the state,
14	including in particular the increased need for health professionals
15	with doctoral-level training.
16	(c) Not later than November 1, 2018, the board shall submit
17	to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house
18	of representatives, and each legislative standing committee with
19	primary jurisdiction over higher education the results of its study
20	under this section and recommendations for legislative or other
21	action.
22	(d) The board may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and
23	donations from any public or private source to conduct the study,
24	prepare the report, and develop recommendations as required under
25	this section.
26	(e) This section expires January 1, 2019.
27	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
