A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to driver's and learner licenses.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 521.001(a)(3), Transportation Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (3) "Driver's license" means an authorization issued
- 7 by the department for the operation of a motor vehicle. The term
- 8 includes:
- 9 (A) a temporary license or learner license
- 10 [instruction permit]; and
- 11 (B) an occupational license.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 521.0475(a), Transportation Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) [or (c)], the
- 15 department shall provide a certified abstract of a complete driving
- 16 record of a license holder, for a fee of \$20, to the license holder
- 17 or a person eligible to receive the information under Sections
- 18 730.007(a)(2)(A), (D), and (I).
- 19 SECTION 3. Sections 521.050(a) and (c), Transportation
- 20 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 21 (a) In addition to the provisions of this subchapter
- 22 relating to the disclosure of driver's license information on an
- 23 individual, the department may provide a purchaser, in a format
- 24 prescribed by the department and acceptable to the purchaser, [with

- 1 a magnetic tape of] the names, addresses, and dates of birth of all
- 2 license holders that are contained in the department's basic
- 3 driver's license record file if the purchaser certifies in writing
- 4 that the purchaser is eligible to receive the information under
- 5 Chapter 730.
- 6 (c) The department shall impose and collect a fee of:
- 7 (1) \$2,000 for the initial driver's license
- 8 information provided [each magnetic tape provided] under
- 9 Subsection (a); and
- 10 (2) if the department provides a weekly update of the
- 11 information [on the tape], \$75 for each update.
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 521.121(a), Transportation Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The driver's license must include:
- 15 (1) a distinguishing number assigned by the department
- 16 to the license holder;
- 17 (2) a [color] photograph of the entire face of the
- 18 holder;
- 19 (3) the full name and date of birth of the holder;
- 20 (4) a brief description of the holder; and
- 21 (5) the license holder's residence address or, for a
- 22 license holder using the procedure under Subsection (c), the street
- 23 address of the courthouse in which the license holder or license
- 24 holder's spouse serves as a federal judge or state judge.
- SECTION 5. Sections 521.1211(a) and (b), Transportation
- 26 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 27 (a) In this section, "peace officer" has the meaning

- 1 assigned by Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, except that
- 2 the term includes a special investigator as defined by Article
- 3 2.122, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 4 (b) Notwithstanding Section 521.121(a), the department by
- 5 rule shall adopt procedures for the issuance of a driver's license
- 6 to a peace officer that omits the license holder's actual residence
- 7 address and includes, as an alternative, an address that is [in the
- 8 municipality or county of the peace officer's residence and is]
- 9 acceptable to the department and is in the:
- 10 (1) municipality or county of the peace officer's
- 11 residence; or
- 12 (2) county of the peace officer's place of employment.
- 13 SECTION 6. Section 521.204(b), Transportation Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (b) The department may not issue a Class A, B, or C driver's
- 16 license other than a hardship license to an applicant under 18 years
- 17 of age unless the applicant has held a learner license [an
- 18 instruction permit] or hardship license for at least six months
- 19 preceding the date of the application.
- SECTION 7. The heading to Section 521.222, Transportation
- 21 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 521.222. LEARNER LICENSE [INSTRUCTION PERMIT].
- SECTION 8. Sections 521.222(d), (f), and (g),
- 24 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 25 (d) A learner license [An instruction permit] entitles the
- 26 holder to operate a type of motor vehicle on a highway while:
- 27 (1) the license [permit] is in the holder's

- 1 possession; and
- 2 (2) the holder is accompanied by a person occupying
- 3 the seat by the operator who:
- 4 (A) holds a license that qualifies the operator
- 5 to operate that type of vehicle;
- 6 (B) is 21 years of age or older; and
- 7 (C) has at least one year of driving experience.
- 8 (f) The department may issue <u>a learner license</u> [an
- 9 instruction permit under this section to a person who is subject to
- 10 the registration requirements under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal
- 11 Procedure, and is otherwise eligible for the <u>license</u> [permit]. A
- 12 learner license [An instruction permit] issued under this
- 13 subsection must include a photograph of the person.
- 14 (g) A person who occupies the seat in a vehicle by a holder
- 15 of a learner license [an instruction permit] commits an offense if,
- 16 while the holder is operating the vehicle, the person:
- 17 (1) sleeps;
- 18 (2) is intoxicated, as defined by Section 49.01, Penal
- 19 Code; or
- 20 (3) is engaged in an activity that prevents the person
- 21 from observing and responding to the actions of the operator.
- SECTION 9. Sections 521.271(a) and (a-3), Transportation
- 23 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) Each original driver's license, provisional license,
- 25 learner license [instruction permit], or occupational driver's
- 26 license issued to an applicant who is a citizen, national, or legal
- 27 permanent resident of the United States or a refugee or asylee

- 1 lawfully admitted into the United States expires as follows:
- 2 (1) except as provided by Section 521.2711, a driver's
- 3 license expires on the first birthday of the license holder
- 4 occurring after the sixth anniversary of the date of the
- 5 application;
- 6 (2) a provisional license expires on the 18th
- 7 birthday of the license holder;
- 8 (3) <u>a learner license</u> [an instruction permit] expires
- 9 on the 18th birthday of the license holder;
- 10 (4) an occupational driver's license expires on the
- 11 first anniversary of the court order granting the license; and
- 12 (5) unless an earlier date is otherwise provided, a
- 13 driver's license issued to a person whose residence or domicile is a
- 14 correctional facility or a parole facility expires on the first
- 15 birthday of the license holder occurring after the first
- 16 anniversary of the date of issuance.
- 17 (a-3) Each original provisional license or learner license
- 18 [instruction permit] issued to an applicant who is not a citizen,
- 19 national, or legal permanent resident of the United States or a
- 20 refugee or asylee lawfully admitted into the United States expires
- 21 on the earliest of:
- 22 (1) the 18th birthday of the license holder;
- 23 (2) the first birthday of the license holder occurring
- 24 after the date of the application; or
- 25 (3) the expiration of the license holder's lawful
- 26 presence in the United States as determined by the United States
- 27 agency responsible for citizenship and immigration in compliance

- 1 with federal law.
- 2 SECTION 10. Section 521.272(d), Transportation Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (d) Subsection (c) does not apply to a:
- 5 (1) [a] provisional license;
- 6 (2) <u>learner license</u> [an instruction permit] issued
- 7 under Section 521.222; or
- 8 (3) [a] hardship license issued under Section 521.223.
- 9 SECTION 11. Section 521.3451, Transportation Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 521.3451. SUSPENSION OR DENIAL ON ORDER OF JUSTICE OR
- 12 MUNICIPAL COURT FOR CONTEMPT OF COURT; REINSTATEMENT. (a) The
- 13 department shall suspend or deny the issuance of a driver's license
- 14 or learner license [instruction permit] on receipt of an order to
- 15 suspend or deny the issuance of either [the] license [or permit]
- 16 from a justice or municipal court under Article 45.050, Code of
- 17 Criminal Procedure.
- (b) The department shall reinstate a license [or permit]
- 19 suspended or reconsider a license [or permit] denied under
- 20 Subsection (a) on receiving notice from the justice or municipal
- 21 court that ordered the suspension or denial that the contemnor has
- 22 fully complied with the court's order.
- SECTION 12. Sections 521.421(c) and (h), Transportation
- 24 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 25 (c) The fee for issuance of a provisional license or learner
- 26 license [instruction permit] is \$15.
- (h) The fee for issuance or renewal of a driver's license, a

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- 1 provisional license, <u>a learner license</u> [an instruction permit], or
- 2 a hardship license issued to a person subject to the registration
- 3 requirements under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure, is \$20.
- 4 SECTION 13. Section 545.424(c), Transportation Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (c) This section does not apply to:
- 7 (1) a person operating a motor vehicle while
- 8 accompanied in the manner required by Section 521.222(d)(2) for the
- 9 holder of a learner license [an instruction permit]; or
- 10 (2) a person licensed by the Federal Communications
- 11 Commission to operate a wireless communication device or a radio
- 12 frequency device.
- 13 SECTION 14. Sections 521.0475(c) and 521.222(b), (c), and
- 14 (e), Transportation Code, are repealed.
- 15 SECTION 15. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 16 521.121 and 521.1211, Transportation Code, apply only to a driver's
- 17 license issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this
- 18 Act. A driver's license issued or renewed before the effective date
- 19 of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the license was
- 20 issued, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 21 SECTION 16. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
