A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to demonstration projects to coordinate eligibility
- 3 renewal and eligibility recertification for certain children in the
- 4 Medicaid and child health plan programs.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 62, Health and Safety
- 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 62.1025 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 62.1025. ELIGIBILITY RENEWAL DEMONSTRATION PROJECT.
- 9 (a) The commission shall establish a demonstration project through
- 10 the child health plan program to allow the commission to
- 11 simultaneously renew the eligibility of multiple children within
- 12 the same household who are eligible for enrollment in the program.
- 13 (b) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary
- 14 to determine the scope of and eligibility for participating in the
- 15 demonstration project.
- 16 (c) The commission shall, to the extent possible, operate
- 17 the demonstration project under this section in conjunction with
- 18 the demonstration project under Section 32.02614, Human Resources
- 19 Code. The demonstration project may not increase the frequency
- 20 with which:

- 21 (1) the eligibility of children participating in the
- 22 demonstration project would otherwise be renewed; or
- 23 (2) those children's household incomes are reviewed
- 24 under Section 62.102(b).

- 1 (d) Not later than December 1, 2020, the commission shall
- 2 submit a report to the legislature regarding the commission's
- 3 progress in establishing and operating the demonstration project
- 4 and recommendations on continuing or expanding the demonstration
- 5 project.
- 6 (e) This section expires September 1, 2021.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 8 is amended by adding Section 32.02614 to read as follows:
- 9 <u>Sec. 32.02614. ELIGIBILITY RECERTIFICATION DEMONSTRATION</u>
- 10 PROJECT. (a) In this section, "child health plan program" has the
- 11 meaning assigned by Section 531.001, Government Code.
- 12 (b) The commission shall establish a demonstration project
- 13 through the medical assistance program to allow the commission, to
- 14 the greatest extent possible, to develop and test solutions to
- 15 <u>simultaneously:</u>
- 16 <u>(1) recertify</u> and renew, as applicable, the
- 17 eligibility of multiple children within the same household who are
- 18 eligible for medical assistance under this chapter or for the child
- 19 health plan program, including the eligibility of siblings when a
- 20 child within the household reaches the age of one; and
- 21 (2) verify the household income of all persons
- 22 <u>described by Subdivision (1) in accordance with this section to</u>
- 23 <u>determine eligibility</u>.
- 24 (c) The demonstration project must include participation by
- 25 one or more households in each of the following categories:
- 26 (1) a household with children who are eligible for
- 27 medical assistance or the child health plan program, at least one of

- 1 whom is younger than the age of one;
- 2 (2) a household with children who are eligible for
- 3 medical assistance or the child health plan program, at least some
- 4 of whom are not siblings; and
- 5 (3) a household with at least one child who is eligible
- 6 for medical assistance and at least one child who is eligible for
- 7 the child health plan program.
- 8 <u>(d) The commission shall simultaneously verify the</u>
- 9 household income of all children within the same household
- 10 participating in the demonstration project not more frequently than
- 11 twice during each 12-month period, with the first verification
- 12 occurring before the sixth month following the earliest date that a
- 13 child within the household was determined to be eligible for the
- 14 medical assistance program, and the second verification occurring
- 15 after that six-month period but before the annual recertification
- 16 <u>date.</u>
- 17 (e) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary
- 18 to determine the scope of and eligibility for participating in the
- 19 demonstration project.
- 20 (f) The commission may establish the demonstration project
- 21 in one or more geographic areas and form partnerships with entities
- 22 experienced in outreach, application assistance, and enrolling
- 23 recipients in the medical assistance program, the child health plan
- 24 program, and any other health benefits coverage.
- 25 (g) The commission shall, to the extent possible, operate
- 26 the demonstration project under this section in conjunction with
- 27 the demonstration project under Section 62.1025, Health and Safety

- 1 Code.
- 2 (h) Not later than December 1, 2020, the commission shall
- 3 submit a report to the legislature regarding the commission's
- 4 progress in establishing and operating the demonstration project
- 5 and recommendations on continuing or expanding the demonstration
- 6 project.
- 7 <u>(i)</u> This section expires September 1, 2021.
- 8 SECTION 3. Not later than September 1, 2018, the Health and
- 9 Human Services Commission shall implement the eligibility renewal
- 10 and eligibility recertification demonstration projects required by
- 11 Section 62.1025, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, and
- 12 Section 32.02614, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 14 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 15 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 16 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 17 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 18 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
