## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to vendor requirements under the Special Supplemental
- 3 Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 1001, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 1001.089 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1001.089. VENDOR REQUIREMENTS FOR WOMEN, INFANTS, AND
- 8 CHILDREN PROGRAM. (a) In this section:
- 9 <u>(1) "Predominantly WIC program vendor" means an</u>
- 10 individual store that:

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- 11 (A) operates and transacts approved WIC program
- 12 <u>food items at a fixed location; and</u>
- 13 <u>(B) has or is expected to have sales of approved</u>
- 14 WIC program food items to WIC program benefits recipients that
- 15 exceed 50 percent of the store's total sales of food items eligible
- 16 for purchase under the supplemental nutrition assistance program
- 17 under Chapter 33, Human Resources Code.
- 18 (2) "WIC program" means the federal special
- 19 supplemental nutrition program for women, infants, and children
- 20 <u>authorized by 42 U.S.C. Section 1786.</u>
- 21 (b) If federal funding for the WIC program is accepted by
- 22 the state, the state shall include as authorized vendors
- 23 predominantly WIC program vendors that meet all other vendor
- 24 requirements established by federal and state WIC program laws and

- 1 regulations.
- 2 (c) The state may not impose requirements for a
- 3 predominantly WIC program vendor in a vendor agreement for the WIC
- 4 program that are outside the scope of the program, including
- 5 requirements relating to:
- 6 (1) vendor hours of operation;
- 7 (2) inventory stocking of food items other than
- 8 approved WIC program food items; or
- 9 (3) restrictions on opening, closing, or relocating a
- 10 store.
- 11 (d) If a change in ownership of a predominantly WIC program
- 12 vendor occurs, the new owner, in applying for a new vendor
- 13 agreement, is subject to the same vendor requirements as
- 14 predominantly WIC program vendors with existing vendor agreements.
- 15 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 16 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 17 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 18 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 19 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 20 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
