- (2) "WIC program" means the federal special 16
- supplemental nutrition program for women, infants, and children 17

- 19 (b) If federal funding for the WIC program is accepted by
- the state, the state shall include as authorized vendors 20
- 21 predominantly WIC program vendors that meet all other vendor
- 22 requirements established by federal and state WIC program laws and
- 23 regulations.
- 24 (c) The state may not impose requirements in a vendor

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- 1 agreement for the WIC program that are outside the scope of the
- 2 program, including requirements relating to:

- 6 (3) restrictions on opening, closing, or relocating a

- 8 (4) restrictions on the sale of a private business.
- 9 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 10 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 11 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 12 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 13 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 14 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
