A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the availability under the public information law of 3 certain documents filed with a county clerk or a district clerk. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 552.117, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 552.117. EXCEPTION: CONFIDENTIALITY 7 OF CERTAIN ADDRESSES, TELEPHONE NUMBERS, SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS, AND 8 PERSONAL FAMILY INFORMATION. $[\frac{a}{a}]$ Information is excepted from 9 the requirements of Section 552.021 if it is information that 10 11 relates to the home address, home telephone number, emergency 12 contact information, or social security number of the following person or that reveals whether the person has family members: 13 14 (1) a current or former official or employee of a governmental body, except as otherwise provided by Section 552.024; 15 16 (2) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or a security officer commissioned under 17 Section 51.212, Education Code, regardless of whether the officer 18

(3) a current or former employee of the

complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable;

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- 1 a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law, a reserve law enforcement 2 3 officer, a commissioned deputy game warden, or a corrections officer in a municipal, county, or state penal institution in this 4 5 state who was killed in the line of duty, regardless of whether the deceased complied with Section 552.024 or 552.1175; 6 7 (5) a commissioned security officer as defined by 8 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, regardless of whether the officer complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable; 9
- 10 (6) an officer or employee of a community supervision and corrections department established under Chapter 76 who 11 performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b), regardless of 12 whether the officer or employee complies with Section 552.024 or 13 14 552.1175;
- 15 (7) a current or former employee of the office of the attorney general who is or was assigned to a division of that office 16 17 the duties of which involve law enforcement, regardless of whether the current or former employee complies with Section 552.024 or 18 552.1175; 19
- a current or former employee of the Texas Juvenile 20 (8) Justice Department or of the predecessors in function of the 21 department, regardless of whether the current or former employee 22 23 complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;
- 24 (9) a current or former juvenile probation 25 supervision officer certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice 26 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department, under Title 12, Human Resources Code, regardless of whether the 27

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- 1 current or former officer complies with Section 552.024 or
- 2 552.1175;
- 3 (10) a current or former employee of a juvenile
- 4 justice program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section
- 5 261.405, Family Code, regardless of whether the current or former
- 6 employee complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175; [or]
- 7 (11) a current or former member of the Texas military
- 8 forces, as that term is defined by Section 437.001; or
- 9 (12) a current legal spouse of a person listed in this
- 10 <u>section</u>, regardless of whether the spouse complies with Section
- 11 552.1175.
- 12 [(b) All documents filed with a county clerk and all
- 13 documents filed with a district clerk are exempt from this
- 14 section.
- SECTION 2. Section 552.1175(a), Government Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (a) This section applies only to:
- 18 (1) peace officers as defined by Article 2.12, Code of
- 19 Criminal Procedure;
- 20 (2) county jailers as defined by Section 1701.001,
- 21 Occupations Code;
- 22 (3) current or former employees of the Texas
- 23 Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of
- 24 the department or any division of the department;
- 25 (4) commissioned security officers as defined by
- 26 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;
- 27 (5) employees of a district attorney, criminal

- 1 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose
- 2 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services
- 3 matters;
- 4 (6) officers and employees of a community supervision
- 5 and corrections department established under Chapter 76 who perform
- 6 a duty described by Section 76.004(b);
- 7 (7) criminal investigators of the United States as
- 8 described by Article 2.122(a), Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 9 (8) police officers and inspectors of the United
- 10 States Federal Protective Service;
- 11 (9) current and former employees of the office of the
- 12 attorney general who are or were assigned to a division of that
- 13 office the duties of which involve law enforcement;
- 14 (10) current or former juvenile probation and
- 15 detention officers certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 16 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department,
- 17 under Title 12, Human Resources Code;
- 18 (11) current or former employees of a juvenile justice
- 19 program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section 261.405,
- 20 Family Code;
- 21 (12) current or former employees of the Texas Juvenile
- 22 Justice Department or the predecessors in function of the
- 23 department; [and]
- 24 (13) federal judges and state judges as defined by
- 25 Section 13.0021, Election Code; and
- 26 (14) the current legal spouse of an individual listed
- 27 in this subsection.

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- 1 SECTION 3. Section 552.1175(e), Government Code, is 2 repealed.
- 3 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 4 a request for information that is received by a governmental body or
- 5 an officer for public information on or after the effective date of
- 6 this Act. A request for information that was received before the
- 7 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 8 date the request was received, and the former law is continued in
- 9 effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect January 1, 2018.
