- 5 SECTION 1. Section 534.106(b), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A pilot program established under this subchapter <u>must</u>
- 8 [may] operate for at least [up to] 24 months. A pilot program may
- 9 cease operation if the pilot program service provider terminates
- 10 the contract with the commission before the agreed-to termination
- 11 date.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 534.111, Government Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 534.111. CONCLUSION OF PILOT PROGRAMS;
- 15 EXPIRATION. On September 1, 2019 [2018]:
- 16 (1) each pilot program established under this
- 17 subchapter that is still in operation must conclude; and
- 18 (2) this subchapter expires.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 534.201(b), Government Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- 21 (b) On September 1, 2020 [2018], the commission shall
- 22 transition the provision of Medicaid benefits to individuals to
- 23 whom this section applies to the STAR + PLUS Medicaid managed care
- 24 program delivery model or the most appropriate integrated capitated

- 1 managed care program delivery model, as determined by the
- 2 commission based on cost-effectiveness and the experience of the
- 3 STAR + PLUS Medicaid managed care program in providing basic
- 4 attendant and habilitation services and of the pilot programs
- 5 established under Subchapter C, subject to Subsection (c)(1).
- 6 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 7 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 8 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 9 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 10 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 11 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
