1-19 relating to the delivery of certain Medicaid services to persons
 1-20 with an intellectual or developmental disability.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section 534.111, Government Code, is amended to
 1-23 read as follows:

1-24 Sec. 534.111. CONCLUSION OF PILOT PROGRAMS;
 1-25 EXPIRATION. On September 1, 2019 [~~2018~~]:

1-26 (1) each pilot program established under this
 1-27 subchapter that is still in operation must conclude; and

1-28 (2) this subchapter expires.

1-29 SECTION 2. Section 534.201(b), Government Code, is amended
 1-30 to read as follows:

1-31 (b) On September 1, 2020 [~~2018~~], the commission shall
 1-32 transition the provision of Medicaid benefits to individuals to
 1-33 whom this section applies to the STAR + PLUS Medicaid managed care
 1-34 program delivery model or the most appropriate integrated capitated
 1-35 managed care program delivery model, as determined by the
 1-36 commission based on cost-effectiveness and the experience of the
 1-37 STAR + PLUS Medicaid managed care program in providing basic
 1-38 attendant and habilitation services and of the pilot programs
 1-39 established under Subchapter C, subject to Subsection (c)(1).

1-40 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act
 1-41 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
 1-42 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
 1-43 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
 1-44 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
 1-45 waiver or authorization is granted.

1-46 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
