SERVICES NOT CONSTITUTING COSMETOLOGY. 11 Notwithstanding Section 1602.002(a), "cosmetology" does not 12 include threading, which involves removing unwanted hair from a 13 14 person by using a piece of thread that is looped around the hair and 15 pulled to remove the hair and includes the incidental trimming of eyebrow hair. 16
