3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 61.09091 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 61.09091. LEGISLATIVE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM. (a) The
7	board shall establish and administer a legislative internship
8	program under which each eligible student selected to participate
9	in the program may earn six hours of academic credit toward the
10	student's degree program and a \$5,000 cost of living stipend for
11	serving as a legislative intern for an office of a member of the
12	legislature, a state agency, or a local governmental entity.
13	(b) To participate in the legislative internship program, a
14	student must:
15	(1) apply for an internship in the manner prescribed
16	by the board;
17	(2) have completed at least 60 hours toward an
18	undergraduate degree;
19	(3) be enrolled at an institution of higher education;
20	(4) demonstrate exceptional skills in writing,
21	composition, and computer literacy; and
22	(5) comply with other requirements established by the
23	board under this section.
24	(c) The board shall adopt rules for the administration of

- 1 this section, including rules prescribing the procedure for the
- 2 application by, and the selection of, students eligible to
- 3 participate in the legislative internship program.
- 4 (d) The board may accept gifts, grants, and donations for
- 5 the purposes of this section.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
