1-19 relating to the issuance of identification documentation for foster  
 1-20 care youth.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 264, Family Code, is  
 1-23 amended by adding Section 264.1211 to read as follows:

1-24 Sec. 264.1211. RECORDS AND DOCUMENTS FOR CHILDREN AGING OUT  
 1-25 OF FOSTER CARE. The department in cooperation with volunteer  
 1-26 advocates from a charitable organization described by Subchapter C,  
 1-27 Chapter 107, and the Department of Public Safety shall develop  
 1-28 procedures to ensure that a foster child obtains a driver's license  
 1-29 or personal identification card before the child leaves the  
 1-30 conservatorship of the department.

1-31 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
 1-32 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
 1-33 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
 1-34 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
 1-35 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
