- SECTION 3. Section 1101.057, Insurance Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a premium, cost, charge, administrative expense, or fee associated with a life insurance policy that is delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2018. A premium, cost, charge, administrative expense, or fee associated with a life insurance policy delivered, issued for
- 8 delivery, or renewed before January 1, 2018, is governed by the law
- 9 as it existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 10 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
