A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the authority of advanced practice registered nurses
3 practicing in certain areas.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
ARTICLE 1. INDEPENDENT PRACTICE AND PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY FOR
ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES PRACTICING IN CERTAIN AREAS

SECTION 1.001. Section 301.002, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subdivision (2) and adding Subdivisions (6) and (7) to read as follows:

(2) "Professional nursing" means the performance of an 10 act that requires substantial specialized judgment and skill, the 11 proper performance of which is based on knowledge and application 12 of the principles of biological, physical, and social science as 13 14 acquired by a completed course in an approved school of professional nursing. The term does not include acts of medical 15 16 diagnosis or the prescription of therapeutic or corrective measures. Professional nursing involves: 17

(A) the observation, assessment, intervention,
evaluation, rehabilitation, care and counsel, or health teachings
of a person who is ill, injured, infirm, or experiencing a change in
normal health processes;

(B) the maintenance of health or prevention ofillness;

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(C) the administration of a medication or

No. 3395 treatment as ordered by a health care practitioner legally 1 authorized to prescribe the medication or treatment [physician, 2 podiatrist, or dentist]; 3 4 the supervision or teaching of nursing; (D) 5 (E) administration, the supervision, and evaluation of nursing practices, policies, and procedures; 6 7 the requesting, receiving, signing for, and (F) 8 distribution of prescription drug samples to patients at practices at which an advanced practice registered nurse is authorized to 9 10 sign prescription drug orders as provided by Subchapter B, Chapter 157, or Section 301.357; 11 12 (G) the performance of an act delegated by a physician under Section 157.0512, 157.054, 157.058, or 157.059; 13 14 [and] 15 (H) the development of the nursing care plan; and 16 (I) the prescribing and ordering of drugs and 17 devices by an advanced practice registered nurse as authorized by the board under Section 301.357. 18 19 (6) "Controlled substance" has the meaning assigned by Section 157.051. 20 21 (7) "Prescribe or order a drug or device" has the meaning assigned by Section 157.051. 22 SECTION 1.002. Section 301.152(b), Occupations Code, 23 is 24 amended to read as follows: (b) The board shall adopt rules to: 25 26 (1) license a registered nurse as an advanced practice registered nurse; 27

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(2) establish:

2 any specialized (A) training, education or 3 including pharmacology, that an advanced practice registered nurse must have to prescribe or order a drug or device as delegated by a 4 5 physician under Section 157.0512 or 157.054 or as authorized by the board under Section 301.357; 6

7 a system for approving an advanced practice (B) 8 registered nurse to prescribe or order a drug or device as delegated by a physician under Section 157.0512 or 157.054 or as authorized by 9 10 the board under Section 301.357 on the receipt of evidence of completing the specialized education and training requirement 11 12 under Paragraph (A); and

13 (C) а system for issuing а prescription 14 authorization number to an advanced practice registered nurse 15 approved under Paragraph (B); and

16 (3) concurrently renew any license or approval granted 17 to an advanced practice registered nurse under this subsection and a license renewed by the advanced practice registered nurse under 18 19 Section 301.301.

SECTION 1.003. Subchapter H, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, 20 is amended by adding Section 301.357 to read as follows: 21

Sec. 301.357. INDEPENDENT PRACTICE BY AND PRESCRIBING AND 22 ORDERING AUTHORITY OF CERTAIN ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES. 23 24 An advanced practice registered nurse may practice as a (a) licensed independent practitioner if the advanced practice 25 26 registered nurse is practicing in a county: 27

(1) in which there are no practicing primary care

1 physicians; and 2 (2) that: (A) has been designated as a medically 3 underserved area under state or federal law; or 4 5 (B) contains a medically underserved population. (b) The board may authorize an advanced practice registered 6 nurse practicing in a county described by Subsection (a) to 7 prescribe and order drugs and devices, excluding controlled 8 substances, if the advanced practice registered nurse has been 9 10 issued a prescription authorization number under Section 301.152(b). 11 ARTICLE 2. CONFORMING AMENDMENTS 12 SECTION 2.001. Section 38.151(1), Education Code, 13 is 14 amended to read as follows: (1) "Advanced practice nurse" has the meaning assigned 15 to "advanced practice registered nurse" by Section 301.152, 16 17 Occupations Code. SECTION 2.002. Section 671.001(b), Government Code, 18 is amended to read as follows: 19 (b) The pilot program must provide for the following: 20 21 (1) a licensed advanced practice registered nurse as defined by Section 301.152, Occupations Code, or a licensed 22 23 physician assistant as described by Chapter 204, Occupations Code, 24 who is employed by the state or whose services are acquired by contract, who will be located at a state office complex; 25 26 (2) if applicable, a licensed physician, who is 27 employed by a state governmental entity for purposes other than the

1 pilot program or whose services are acquired by contract, who will 2 delegate to and supervise the advanced practice registered nurse or 3 physician assistant under a prescriptive authority agreement under 4 Chapter 157, Occupations Code;

5 (3) appropriate office space and equipment for the 6 advanced practice registered nurse or physician assistant to 7 provide basic medical care to employees at the state office complex 8 where the nurse or physician assistant is located; and

9 (4) professional liability insurance covering 10 services provided by the advanced practice registered nurse or the 11 physician assistant.

SECTION 2.003. Sections 483.001(4) and (12), Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

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(4) "Designated agent" means:

(A) a licensed nurse, physician assistant,
pharmacist, or other individual designated by a practitioner to
communicate prescription drug orders to a pharmacist;

(B) a licensed nurse, physician assistant, or
pharmacist employed in a health care facility to whom the
practitioner communicates a prescription drug order; or

(C) [a] <u>an advanced practice</u> registered nurse or physician assistant authorized by a practitioner to carry out a prescription drug order for dangerous drugs under Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code<u>, or an advanced practice registered</u> <u>nurse authorized by a practitioner to carry out a prescription drug</u> <u>order for dangerous drugs under other law</u>.

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(12) "Practitioner" means:

(A) a person licensed by the Texas Medical Board,
 State Board of Dental Examiners, Texas State Board of Podiatric
 Medical Examiners, Texas Optometry Board, <u>Texas Board of Nursing</u>,
 or State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners to prescribe and
 administer dangerous drugs;

6 (B) a person licensed by another state in a 7 health field in which, under the laws of this state, a licensee may 8 legally prescribe dangerous drugs;

9 (C) a person licensed in Canada or Mexico in a 10 health field in which, under the laws of this state, a licensee may 11 legally prescribe dangerous drugs; or

(D) an advanced practice registered nurse or
physician assistant to whom a physician has delegated the authority
to prescribe or order a drug or device under Section 157.0511,
157.0512, or 157.054, Occupations Code.

SECTION 2.004. Section 32.03141, Human Resources Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 32.03141. AUTHORITY OF ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED 18 NURSES AND 19 PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS REGARDING DURABLE MEDICAL 20 EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES. To the extent allowed by federal law, in addition to other health care practitioners authorized by federal 21 22 law, the following persons may order and prescribe durable medical equipment and supplies under the medical assistance program: 23

24 (1) an advanced practice registered nurse authorized
 25 to prescribe and order drugs and devices under Section 301.357,
 26 Occupations Code; and

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(2) an advanced practice registered nurse or physician

1 assistant acting under adequate physician supervision and to whom a
2 physician has delegated the authority to prescribe and order drugs
3 and devices under Chapter 157, Occupations Code[, may order and
4 prescribe durable medical equipment and supplies under the medical
5 assistance program].

6 SECTION 2.005. Section 843.312, Insurance Code, is amended 7 to read as follows:

Sec. 843.312. PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS AND ADVANCED PRACTICE 8 REGISTERED NURSES. (a) A health maintenance organization may not 9 10 refuse a request by a physician participating in the health maintenance organization delivery network and a physician 11 12 assistant or advanced practice registered nurse who is authorized by the physician to provide care under Subchapter B, Chapter 157, 13 14 Occupations Code, or an advanced practice registered nurse who is 15 authorized to provide care by the physician under other law, to identify a physician assistant or advanced practice registered 16 17 nurse as a provider in the network.

(b) A health maintenance organization may refuse a request under Subsection (a) if the physician assistant or advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurse does not meet the quality of care standards previously established by the health maintenance organization for participation in the network by physician assistants and advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurses.

24 SECTION 2.006. Section 1301.001(1-a), Insurance Code, is 25 amended to read as follows:

26 (1-a) "Health care provider" means a practitioner,27 institutional provider, or other person or organization that

1 furnishes health care services and that is licensed or otherwise 2 authorized to practice in this state. The term includes a 3 pharmacist, [and] a pharmacy, and an advanced practice registered 4 nurse. The term does not include a physician.

5 SECTION 2.007. Section 1301.052, Insurance Code, is amended 6 to read as follows:

Sec. 1301.052. DESIGNATION OF ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED 7 8 NURSE OR PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT AS PREFERRED PROVIDER. An insurer offering a preferred provider benefit plan may not refuse a request 9 10 made by a physician participating as a preferred provider under the plan and an advanced practice registered nurse or physician 11 12 assistant to have the advanced practice registered nurse or physician assistant included as a preferred provider under the plan 13 14 if:

(1) the advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurse or physician assistant is authorized by the physician to provide care under Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code<u>, or the advanced</u> <u>practice registered nurse is authorized to provide care by the</u> physician under other law; and

20 (2) the advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurse or 21 physician assistant meets the quality of care standards previously 22 established by the insurer for participation in the plan by 23 advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurses and physician assistants.

24 SECTION 2.008. Section 1451.001(2), Insurance Code, is 25 amended to read as follows:

26 (2) "Advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurse" means an 27 individual licensed by the Texas Board of Nursing as a registered

1 nurse and <u>licensed</u> [recognized] by that board as an advanced
2 practice registered nurse.

3 SECTION 2.009. Section 1451.104(c), Insurance Code, is 4 amended to read as follows:

(c) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a health insurance 5 policy may provide for a different amount of payment or 6 reimbursement for scheduled services or procedures performed by an 7 8 advanced practice registered nurse, nurse first assistant, licensed surgical assistant, or physician assistant if 9 the 10 methodology used to compute the amount is the same as the methodology used to compute the amount of payment or reimbursement 11 12 when the services or procedures are provided by a physician.

13 SECTION 2.010. Section 1451.106, Insurance Code, is amended 14 to read as follows:

15 Sec. 1451.106. SELECTION OF ADVANCED PRACTICE <u>REGISTERED</u> 16 NURSE. An insured may select an advanced practice <u>registered</u> nurse 17 to provide the services scheduled in the health insurance policy 18 that are within the scope of the nurse's license.

SECTION 2.011. Section 1452.051(1), Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows:

(1) "Advanced practice nurse" has the meaning assigned
 <u>to</u> "advanced practice registered nurse" by Section 301.152,
 Occupations Code.

24 SECTION 2.012. Sections 551.003(14) and (34), Occupations 25 Code, are amended to read as follows:

26 (14) "Designated agent" means:

27 (A) an individual, including a licensed nurse,

1 physician assistant, or pharmacist:

2 (i) who is designated by a practitioner and
3 authorized to communicate a prescription drug order to a
4 pharmacist; and

5 (ii) for whom the practitioner assumes
6 legal responsibility;

7 (B) a licensed nurse, physician assistant, or
8 pharmacist employed in a health care facility to whom a
9 practitioner communicates a prescription drug order; or

10 (C) a registered nurse or physician assistant 11 authorized by a practitioner to administer a prescription drug 12 order for a dangerous drug under Subchapter B, Chapter 157<u>, or an</u> 13 <u>advanced practice registered nurse authorized by a practitioner to</u> 14 <u>administer a prescription drug order for a dangerous drug under</u> 15 <u>other law</u>.

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(34) "Practitioner" means:

(A) a person licensed or registered to prescribe, distribute, administer, or dispense a prescription drug or device in the course of professional practice in this state, including a physician, dentist, podiatrist, <u>advanced practice registered</u> <u>nurse,</u> or veterinarian but excluding a person licensed under this subtitle;

(B) a person licensed by another state, Canada,
or the United Mexican States in a health field in which, under the
law of this state, a license holder in this state may legally
prescribe a dangerous drug;

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(C) a person practicing in another state and

1 licensed by another state as a physician, dentist, veterinarian, or current federal podiatrist, who 2 has а Drug Enforcement 3 Administration registration number and who may legally prescribe a Schedule II, III, IV, or V controlled substance, as specified under 4 5 Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code, in that other state; or

6 (D) an advanced practice registered nurse or 7 physician assistant to whom a physician has delegated the authority 8 to prescribe or order a drug or device under Section 157.0511, 9 157.0512, or 157.054.

10 SECTION 2.013. Section 563.053, Occupations Code, is 11 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 563.053. DISPENSING OF DANGEROUS DRUGS IN CERTAIN 12 RURAL AREAS. (a) In this section, "reimbursement for cost" means 13 14 additional charge, separate from that imposed for an the physician's or advanced practice registered nurse's professional 15 services, that includes the cost of the drug product and all other 16 17 actual costs to the physician or advanced practice registered nurse incidental to providing the dispensing service. The term does not 18 19 include a separate fee imposed for the act of dispensing the drug itself. 20

(b) This section applies to an area located in a county with a population of 5,000 or less, or in a municipality or an unincorporated town with a population of less than 2,500, that is within a 15-mile radius of the physician's <u>or advanced practice</u> <u>registered nurse's</u> office and in which a pharmacy is not located. This section does not apply to a municipality or an unincorporated town that is adjacent to a municipality with a population of 2,500

1 or more.

(c) A physician who practices medicine <u>or an advanced</u>
<u>practice registered nurse who is authorized to prescribe and order</u>
<u>drugs and devices under Section 301.357 and who practices advanced</u>
<u>practice registered nursing</u> in an area described by Subsection (b)
may:

7 (1) maintain a supply of dangerous drugs in the 8 physician's <u>or advanced practice registered nurse's</u> office to be 9 dispensed in the course of treating the physician's <u>or advanced</u> 10 <u>practice registered nurse's</u> patients; and

11 (2) be reimbursed for the cost of supplying those12 drugs without obtaining a license under Chapter 558.

13 (d) A physician <u>or advanced practice registered nurse</u> who
14 dispenses dangerous drugs under Subsection (c) shall:

(1) comply with each labeling provision under thissubtitle applicable to that class of drugs; and

17 (2) oversee compliance with packaging and18 recordkeeping provisions applicable to that class of drugs.

A physician who desires to dispense dangerous drugs 19 (e) under this section shall notify both the board and the Texas Medical 20 [State] Board [of Medical Examiners] that the physician practices 21 in an area described by Subsection (b). An advanced practice 22 registered nurse who desires to dispense dangerous drugs under this 23 24 section shall notify both the board and the Texas Board of Nursing that the advanced practice registered nurse practices in an area 25 26 described by Subsection (b). The physician or advanced practice registered nurse may continue to dispense dangerous drugs in the 27

1 area until the board determines, after notice and hearing, that the 2 physician <u>or advanced practice registered nurse</u> no longer practices 3 in an area described by Subsection (b).

4 SECTION 2.014. Section 605.002(14), Occupations Code, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 (14) "Orthotics" means the science and practice of 7 measuring, designing, fabricating, assembling, fitting, adjusting, 8 or servicing an orthosis under an order from a licensed physician, chiropractor, [or] podiatrist, [an] advanced practice 9 or 10 registered nurse, or from an advanced practice registered nurse or physician assistant acting under the delegation and supervision of 11 12 a licensed physician as provided by Subchapter B, Chapter 157, and rules adopted by the Texas Medical Board, for the correction or 13 alleviation of a neuromuscular or musculoskeletal dysfunction, 14 15 disease, injury, or deformity.

SECTION 2.015. Section 605.2515, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 605.2515. ADDITIONAL LICENSE: DEVICE MANUFACTURER. 18 А 19 person licensed to practice orthotics or prosthetics who measures, 20 designs, fabricates, fits, assembles, adjusts, or services an orthosis or a prosthesis under an order from a licensed physician, 21 22 chiropractor, [or] podiatrist, or [an] advanced practice registered nurse, or from an advanced practice registered nurse or 23 physician assistant acting under the delegation and supervision of 24 a licensed physician as provided by Subchapter B, Chapter 157, and 25 26 rules adopted by the Texas Medical Board, for a specific patient is exempt from licensing as a device manufacturer under Subchapter L, 27

Chapter 431, Health and Safety Code. A person licensed to practice 1 orthotics or prosthetics who fabricates or assembles an orthosis or 2 a prosthesis without an order from a licensed physician, 3 4 chiropractor, [or] podiatrist, or [an] advanced practice 5 registered nurse, or from an advanced practice registered nurse or physician assistant acting under the delegation and supervision of 6 a licensed physician as provided by Subchapter B, Chapter 157, and 7 8 rules adopted by the Texas Medical Board, for a specific patient is 9 required to be licensed as a device manufacturer under Subchapter L, Chapter 431, Health and Safety Code. 10

ARTICLE 3. TRANSITION AND EFFECTIVE DATE SECTION 3.001. Not later than February 1, 2018, the Texas Board of Nursing shall adopt the rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this Act.

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SECTION 3.002. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
