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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of the blue alert system to aid in the
3	apprehension of individuals who are suspected of harming law
4	enforcement officers and individuals who are fugitives from
5	correctional facilities.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by
8	adding Subchapter P to read as follows:
9	SUBCHAPTER P. BLUE ALERT SYSTEM
10	Sec. 411.441. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
11	(1) "Alert system" means the statewide blue alert
12	system that is developed and implemented under this subchapter.
13	(2) "Custody" has the meaning assigned by Section
14	38.01, Penal Code.
15	(3) "Escape" has the meaning assigned by Section
16	38.01, Penal Code.
17	(4) "Law enforcement agency" means a law enforcement
18	agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of:
19	(A) an alleged offense that resulted in the death
20	or serious bodily injury of a law enforcement officer; or
21	(B) the escape of a fugitive from custody.
22	(5) "Law enforcement officer" means a person who is a
23	peace officer under Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or a
24	person who is a federal law enforcement officer, as defined by 5

- 2 (6) "Serious bodily injury" has the meaning assigned
- 3 by Section 1.07, Penal Code.
- 4 Sec. 411.442. BLUE ALERT SYSTEM. With the cooperation of
- 5 the Texas Department of Transportation, the office of the governor,
- 6 and other appropriate law enforcement agencies in this state, the
- 7 department shall develop and implement a statewide blue alert
- 8 system to be activated to aid in the apprehension of an individual
- 9 who:
- 10 (1) is suspected of killing or causing serious bodily
- 11 injury to a law enforcement officer; or
- 12 (2) has escaped from custody while the person is:
- 13 (A) under arrest for, lawfully detained for, or
- 14 charged with an offense punishable as a felony; or
- (B) confined in a secure correctional facility,
- 16 <u>as defined by Section 1.07, Penal Code.</u>
- Sec. 411.443. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The director is the
- 18 statewide coordinator of the alert system.
- 19 (b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as
- 20 necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert system. The
- 21 rules and directives must include:
- (1) the procedures to be used by a law enforcement
- 23 agency to verify whether:
- 24 (A) an individual is a suspect or fugitive as
- 25 described by Section 411.442 and is not yet apprehended; and
- 26 (B) the activation of the alert system would aid
- 27 in the apprehension of that individual;

- 1 (2) a description of the circumstances under which a
- 2 law enforcement agency is required to report a missing suspect or
- 3 fugitive to the department; and
- 4 (3) the procedures to be used by an individual or
- 5 entity to report information about a missing suspect or fugitive to
- 6 designated media outlets in Texas.
- 7 (c) The director shall prescribe forms for use by law
- 8 enforcement agencies in requesting activation of the alert system.
- 9 Sec. 411.444. DEPARTMENT TO RECRUIT PARTICIPANTS. The
- 10 department shall recruit public and commercial television and radio
- 11 broadcasters, private commercial entities, state or local
- 12 governmental entities, the public, and other appropriate persons to
- 13 assist in developing and implementing the alert system.
- 14 Sec. 411.445. STATE AGENCIES. (a) A state agency
- 15 participating in the alert system shall:
- 16 (1) cooperate with the department and assist in
- 17 developing and implementing the alert system; and
- 18 (2) establish a plan for providing relevant
- 19 information to its officers, investigators, or employees, as
- 20 appropriate, once the alert system has been activated.
- 21 (b) In addition to its duties as a state agency under
- 22 Subsection (a), the Texas Department of Transportation shall
- 23 establish a plan for providing relevant information to the public
- 24 through an existing system of dynamic message signs located across
- 25 the state.
- Sec. 411.446. NOTIFICATION TO DEPARTMENT. (a) A law
- 27 enforcement agency that receives notice of a suspect or fugitive

2	(1) confirm the accuracy of the information; and
3	(2) if the agency believes the missing suspect or
4	fugitive poses a threat to other law enforcement officers or to the
5	public, provide notice to the department.
6	(b) A law enforcement agency providing notice to the
7	department under Subsection (a) shall include with that notice a
8	detailed description of the missing suspect or fugitive and, if
9	applicable, any available portion of the license plate number of a
10	motor vehicle being used by the suspect or fugitive.
11	Sec. 411.447. ACTIVATION OF BLUE ALERT SYSTEM. (a) When a
12	law enforcement agency notifies the department under Section
13	411.446, the department shall confirm the accuracy of the
14	information and, if confirmed, immediately issue an alert through
15	the alert system in accordance with department rules.
16	(b) In issuing the alert, the department shall send the
17	alert to designated media outlets in Texas. Following receipt of
18	the alert, participating radio stations and television stations and
19	other participating media outlets may issue the alert at designated
20	intervals to assist in locating the missing suspect or fugitive.
21	(c) The department shall also send the alert to:
22	(1) any appropriate law enforcement agency;
23	(2) the Texas Department of Transportation;
24	(3) the division of emergency management of the office
25	of the governor; and
26	(4) a state agency described by Section 411.445.
27	Sec. 411.448. CONTENT OF ALERT. The alert must include:

1 who has not yet been apprehended shall:

- 1 (1) all appropriate information that is provided by
- 2 the law enforcement agency under Section 411.446 and that may lead
- 3 to the apprehension of the missing suspect or fugitive; and
- 4 (2) a statement instructing any person with
- 5 information related to the missing suspect or fugitive to contact a
- 6 law enforcement agency.
- 7 Sec. 411.449. TERMINATION OF ALERT SYSTEM. (a) The
- 8 director shall terminate any activation of the alert system with
- 9 respect to a particular missing suspect or fugitive not later than
- 10 the earlier of the date on which:
- 11 (1) the missing suspect or fugitive is apprehended;
- 12 (2) the department receives evidence that the missing
- 13 suspect or fugitive has left this state; or
- 14 (3) the department determines that the alert system
- 15 will no longer aid in the apprehension of the missing suspect or
- 16 fugitive.
- 17 (b) A law enforcement agency that apprehends a missing
- 18 suspect or fugitive who is the subject of an alert under this
- 19 subchapter shall notify the department as soon as possible that the
- 20 missing suspect or fugitive has been apprehended.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
