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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the state safety oversight program for rail fixed guideway public transportation systems. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 455, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 CHAPTER 455. [GENERAL] POWERS AND DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT OF 7 TRANSPORTATION REGARDING MASS TRANSPORTATION 8 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 455, Transportation Code, is amended by designating Sections 455.001 through 455.004 as Subchapter A and 10 adding a subchapter heading to read as follows: 11 12 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES SECTION 3. Section 455.002, Transportation Code, is amended 13 to read as follows: 14 Sec. 455.002. DEPARTMENT POWERS REGARDING 15 MASS 16 TRANSPORTATION. The Texas Department of Transportation may: purchase, construct, lease, and contract for 17 (1) public transportation systems; 18 the expertise of recognized private 19 (2) use authorities or consultants to plan and design public and mass 20 21 transportation systems; 22 (3) represent this state in each public and mass 23 transportation matter before a state or federal agency; subject to Section 455.052, apply for and receive 24 (4)

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1 a gift or grant from a governmental or private source for use in performing the department's functions under this chapter; 2 3 (5) contract as necessary to perform a function under 4 this chapter; and 5 (6) recommend legislation necessary to advance this 6 state's interest in public and mass transportation. 7 SECTION 4. Chapter 455, Transportation Code, is amended by 8 adding Subchapter B to read as follows: 9 SUBCHAPTER B. STATE SAFETY OVERSIGHT PROGRAM Sec. 455.051. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "rail fixed 10 guideway public transportation system" has the meaning assigned by 11 12 49 C.F.R. Section 674.7. Sec. 455.052. DESIGNATION OF STATE SAFETY OVERSIGHT AGENCY; 13 REQUIREMENTS AND PROHIBITIONS. (a) The department is designated 14 15 as the agency responsible for implementing a state safety oversight program that satisfies the requirements of 49 U.S.C. Section 16 17 5329(e). (b) Unless waived under 49 U.S.C. Section 5329(e), the 18 19 department: (1) shall be financially and legally independent from 20 any rail fixed guideway public transportation system under the 21 oversight of the department; and 22 (2) may not employ an individual who is also employed 23 24 by a rail fixed guideway public transportation system under the oversight of the department. 25 26 (c) The department may not directly provide public transportation services in an area with a rail fixed guideway

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1 public transportation system under the oversight of the department. 2 (d) A public transportation entity may not provide funds to 3 the department. 4 Sec. 455.053. OVERSIGHT. The department shall oversee all 5 safety aspects of rail fixed guideway public transportation systems in acco<u>rdance with 49 U.S.C. Section 5329, including the</u> 6 7 development, implementation, and application of the public transportation agency safety plan. 8 9 Sec. 455.054. ENFORCEMENT. The department shall: (1) enforce federal and state laws on rail fixed 10 11 guideway public transportation safety; 12 (2) review, revise, approve, oversee, and enforce the public transportation agency safety plan required under 49 U.S.C. 13 Section 5329(d), including the implementation by a rail fixed 14 15 guideway public transportation system of the system's plan; 16 (3) investigate and enforce the safety of rail fixed 17 guideway public transportation systems; and (4) coordinate all <u>enforcement responsibilities with</u> 18 19 other governmental entities as needed. Sec. 455.055. STAFFING LEVELS; TRAINING. (a) 20 The department, in consultation with the Federal Transit 21 Administration, shall determine an appropriate staffing level for 22 the state safety oversight program that is commensurate with the 23 24 number, size, and complexity of rail fixed guideway public transportation systems in this state. 25 26 (b) The department shall ensure that the personnel who are responsible for rail fixed guideway public transportation safety 27

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1 oversight are qualified to perform oversight functions through 2 appropriate training, including the successful completion of the public transportation safety certification training program 3 established under 49 U.S.C. Section 5329(c). 4 Sec. 455.056. AUDIT OF COMPLIANCE 5 WITH PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AGENCY SAFETY PLAN. At least once every three 6 7 years, the department shall audit the compliance of the rail fixed 8 guideway public transportation systems in this state with the public transportation agency safety plan required by 49 U.S.C. 9 10 Section 5329(d). Sec. 455.057. ANNUAL STATUS REPORT. The department shall 11 12 provide an annual status report on the safety of the state's rail fixed guideway public transportation systems to the governor, the 13 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, 14 15 the Federal Transit Administration, and the governing body of each rail fixed guideway public transportation system under the 16 17 oversight of the department. Sec. 455.058. USE OF CONTRACTOR. (a) The department may 18 19 enter into an agreement with a contractor to act on behalf of the department in carrying out the duties of the department under this 20 21 subchapter. 22 (b) A contractor may not provide services to both the department and a rail fixed guideway public transportation system 23 24 under the oversight of the department, unless the provision of those services is authorized by a waiver issued by the Federal 25

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- 26 <u>Transit Administrator or the administrator's designee.</u>
- 27 Sec. 455.059. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. The data collected

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for and the report of an investigation conducted under this 1 subchapter by the department or a contractor acting on behalf of the 2 department and any part of a rail fixed guideway public 3 transportation system safety plan that concerns security for the 4 5 system are confidential and not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code. 6 7 Sec. 455.060. RULES. The commission shall adopt rules 8 necessary to implement this subchapter. 9 SECTION 5. Section 455.005, Transportation Code, is 10 repealed. SECTION 6. Not later than March 1, 2019, the Texas 11 Transportation Commission shall 12 adopt rules to implement Subchapter B, Chapter 455, Transportation Code, as added by this 13 14 Act. 15 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 16 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
