5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 76, Agriculture Code, is

7	Sec. 76.048. FERAL HOG TOXICANTS; STUDY REQUIRED. (a)
8	Notwithstanding any other law, the department may not register,
9	approve for use, or allow the use of a lethal pesticide, including
10	warfarin, for feral hog control in this state unless a study under
11	Subsection (b) recommends the pesticide be registered for that use.
12	(b) A state agency or institution of higher education may
13	perform a scientific study of potential feral hog control measures
14	in this state. The study must:
15	(1) include controlled field trials;
16	(2) examine the potential use of warfarin or other
17	lethal pesticides for feral hog control;
18	(3) assess the negative impacts to wildlife,
19	agricultural interests, and property owners of the control measures
20	included in the study; and
21	(4) assess the environmental consequences of the
22	control measures included in the study.
23	(c) A state agency or institution of higher education shall

2	(d) A state agency or institution of higher education that
3	performs a study under Subsection (b):
4	(1) is subject to Chapter 552, Government Code, in
5	connection with the study; and
6	(2) shall hold public hearings to obtain input from
7	the public and appropriate stakeholders.
8	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
9	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
10	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
11	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

12 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
