	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of an instructional materials web portal
3	by the commissioner of education.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 31, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter B-2 to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER B-2. INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS WEB PORTAL
8	Sec. 31.081. INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS WEB PORTAL. (a) The
9	commissioner shall develop and maintain a web portal to assist
10	school districts and open-enrollment charter schools in selecting
11	instructional materials under Section 31.101.
12	(b) The web portal must include general information such as
13	price, computer system requirements, and any other relevant
14	specifications for each instructional material:
15	(1) on the instructional materials list, including the
16	list adopted under Section 31.0231; or
17	(2) submitted by a publisher for inclusion in the web
18	portal.
19	(c) The commissioner by rule shall establish the procedure
20	by which a publisher may submit instructional materials for
21	inclusion in the web portal.
22	(d) The commissioner shall use a competitive process to
23	contract for the development of the web portal.
24	Sec. 31.082. QUALITY OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS SUBMITTED

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1	BY PUBLISHER. (a) The commissioner shall contract with a private
2	entity to conduct an independent analysis of each instructional
3	material submitted by a publisher for inclusion in the web portal
4	developed under Section 31.081. The analysis must:
5	(1) evaluate the quality of the material; and
6	(2) determine the extent to which the material covers
7	the essential knowledge and skills identified under Section 28.002
8	for the subject and grade level for which the material is intended
9	to be used, including an identification of:
10	(A) each of the essential knowledge and skills
11	for the subject and grade level or levels covered by the material;
12	and
13	(B) the percentage of the essential knowledge and
14	skills for the subject and grade level or levels covered by the
15	material.
16	(b) The commissioner shall include in the web portal
17	developed under Section 31.081 the results of each analysis
18	conducted under Subsection (a).
19	Sec. 31.083. INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS REPOSITORY. (a) In
20	this section, "open educational resource" means a teaching,
21	learning, or research resource that is in the public domain or has
22	been released under an intellectual property license that permits
23	the free use and repurposing of the resource by any person. The
24	term may include full course curricula, course materials, modules,
25	textbooks, streaming videos, tests, software, and any other tools,
26	materials, or techniques used to support access to knowledge.
27	(b) The commissioner shall include in the web portal

developed under Section 31.081 a repository of open educational 1 resources and other electronic instructional materials that school 2 districts and open-enrollment charter schools may access at no 3 cost, including state-developed open-source instructional 4 materials purchased under Subchapter B-1. 5 6 (c) A publisher may submit instructional materials for 7 inclusion in the repository. Sec. 31.084. RULES. The commissioner may adopt rules as 8 necessary to implement this subchapter. 9 10 SECTION 2. Section 31.004(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 11 To determine whether each student has instructional 12 (b) materials that cover all elements of the essential knowledge and 13 skills as required by Subsection (a), a school district or 14 15 open-enrollment charter school may consider: instructional materials adopted by the State Board 16 (1)17 of Education; materials adopted or purchased by the commissioner 18 (2) under Section 31.0231 or Subchapter B-1; 19 (3) open-source instructional materials submitted by 20 eligible institutions and adopted by the State Board of Education 21 under Section 31.0241; 22 23 (4) open-source instructional materials made 24 available by other public schools; [and] 25 (5) instructional materials developed or purchased by 26 the school district or open-enrollment charter school; and 27 (6) open educational resources and other electronic

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1 <u>instructional materials included in the repository under Section</u> 2 <u>31.083</u>.

3 SECTION 3. Not later than September 1, 2018, the 4 commissioner of education shall develop the web portal required 5 under Subchapter B-2, Chapter 31, Education Code, as added by this 6 Act.

7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
