5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 822, Health and Safety
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 822.008 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 822.008. PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL ANIMAL CONTROL
9	AUTHORITY TO OPERATE IN EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION. A municipal
10	animal control authority may impound and manage dangerous animals,
11	including dangerous dogs, in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of
12	the municipality if:
13	(1) the authority receives a petition signed by at
14	least five residents of the extraterritorial jurisdiction
15	requesting assistance from the authority and alleging that:
16	(A) dangerous animals, including dogs or
17	coyotes, have repeatedly attacked humans, pets, or livestock within
18	the extraterritorial jurisdiction; and
19	(B) due to the presence of dangerous animals, the
20	extraterritorial jurisdiction is an unsafe environment for humans,
21	pets, or livestock; and
22	(2) another animal control authority is not authorized
23	to operate within the extraterritorial jurisdiction.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
