9	DEFENSE. It is an affirmative defense to a civil action based on a
10	claim that the defendant discriminated against the plaintiff on a
11	basis other than race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age,
12	or disability that the defendant could not avoid the cause of action
13	without violating the defendant's sincerely held religious belief.
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 250, Local Government Code, is amended
15	by adding Section 250.008 to read as follows:
16	Sec. 250.008. REGULATIONS REQUIRING VIOLATION OF RELIGIOUS
17	BELIEF PROHIBITED. A county or municipality may not impose a fine
18	or other penalty against a person for violation of an ordinance,
19	order, or other measure that prohibits discrimination on a basis
20	other than race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or
21	disability if compliance with the measure would have required the
